16-16 overall last season, and 6-12 in conference play, the Beavers have turned some heads. They are already two wins shy of equaling last season's conference total, something that is tough to do in the nation's best volleyball conference.

The Oregon State offense features sophomore setter Laura Collins. The Milwaukee, Wis., native has shone brightly for the Beavers, leading them with 656 assists on the year, good for fifth in the Pac-10 with 12.15 assists per game. She will be key for Somera's squad.

Despite their resurgence this season, Oregon State is not yet ranked, but has looked stellar against its ranked opponents so far. They have lost to both No. 4 Stanford and No. 7 Arizona in straight sets, but in each, the score was much closer than the results indicated.

"We're playing well and doing the things we need to do, and as always, we're going to focus on taking care of things on our side of the

court," Somera said.

"Oregon State, what they're doing a nice job of, is not beating themselves," Ferreira said. "They don't make a lot of errors."

As for the Ducks, last week's losses to Stanford and California kept them winless in the young Pac-10 season. Only three matches remain before the first half of conference play is over, and Oregon is staring at a winless first-half for the fourth time in five years. But that isn't a concern for Ferreira.

"We're looking at it as though we want to play well today," Ferreira said. "You're looking to succeed that particular day."

The Oregon defense is ranked fourth in Pac-10 play, with opponents hitting only .166 against the Ducks. But for the team to succeed, the offense has to come out and play as strong as it did against California last weekend.

Junior Stephanie Martin has led the offense in recent weeks, posting a combined 22 kills against Stanford and California last weekend.

"She's responded very well (to Pac-10 play)," Ferreira said about the transfer from the College of Southern Idaho. "She's given us a presence."
