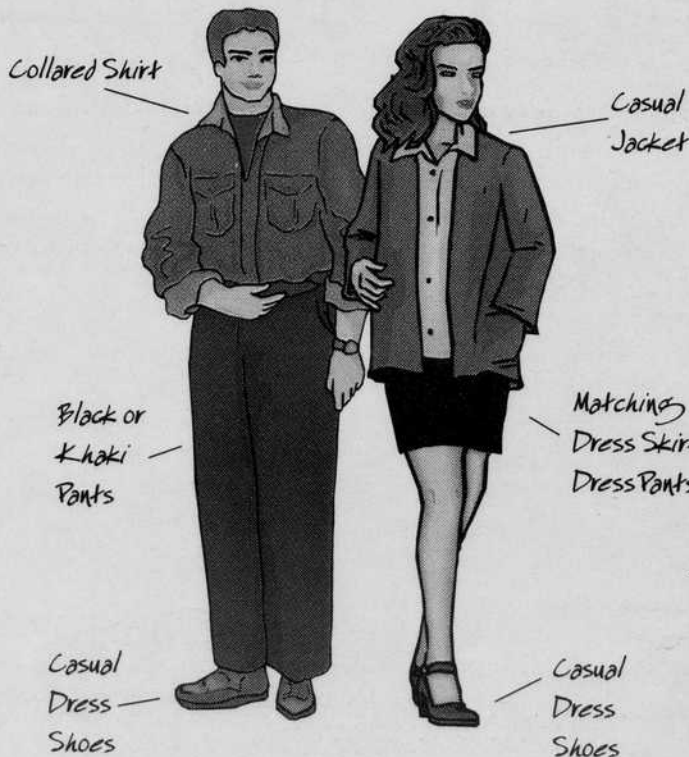

Career Fair Attire

What should I wear to the Career Fair? Well, it depends on what you are hoping to get out of the Fair...

Casual Dress Shoes
