Hard rock group Dead Poets Society will be performing at psychedelic rock band King Black Acid's CD release party for "The Mothman Prophecies" motion picture soundtrack on Feb. 23 at WOW Hall.

Dead Poets Society is a local electronic-goth act whose performance follows the Jan. 8 release of their second album, "Deprogramming."

In addition to releasing two fulllength albums, the group remixed Depeche Mode's "I Feel Loved" tracks and Madonna's "Deeper and Deeper" record.


