Thirty minutes after Thursday's Eugene Emeralds game against Spokane, an expected full house can take to the field to watch a fireworks display.

"There's no other fireworks show where you can sit on a baseball field," Emeralds spokesman Doug Williams said.

With any luck, there should be some fireworks during the game, as well.

Williams said the Emeralds, 4-8 as of Sunday, and Spokane, 4-9 as of Sunday, should provide fans with a competitive game.

Tickets to the game are going fast, however.

Williams said more than 700 tickets were sold Monday and added that he expects only 500 to 600 tickets will be available today. Meaning if action isn't taken soon, all the tickets will be going, going, gone.

"I don't expect to have any tickets available the day of the game," Williams said.

General admission is \$4.50 and \$3.50 for children 12 and younger and for seniors 65 and older. Parking is free.

Gates open at 5 p.m. for the Eugene Pro Rodeo's fireworks display, which will launch at 10 p.m.

The rodeo has events all weekend, but on Thursday, attendees can enjoy some professional bull riding and steer wrestling at 7:30 p.m. and dance the night away after the fireworks show. In between, spectators will have the chance to marvel at a monster truck and motorcycle stunt show.

Eugene Police Department prepares for July 4

After the media attention given to July 4 terrorist threats in Las Vegas and other general warnings of terrorism, local law enforcement will be on alert throughout the holiday this year.

Eugene Police Department spokeswoman Pam Alejandre said there was a "heightened" awareness of terrorism, but EPD always conducts extra patrols on holidays.

"There is no indication of a credible threat," she said. Alejandre added that since Independence Day is a "very patriotic holiday," the Eugene Police Department would work hard to make the day go smoothly.

The Lane County Sheriff's Department will also be on higher alert but won't be taking any new measures because of perceived threats.

"We will not be doing any new measures, but Sept. 11 and other events that have occurred have put us on higher alert" Lane County Sheriff's Sgt. Steven Broome said.

While the sheriff's department isn't taking new measures for Independence Day, their training manuals have been updated to respond to terrorism. This includes two new terrorism officers, new training techniques and a plan to work more closely with fire departments and hospitals.

"I think it's important to assure average citizens that everything we can do is being done," Broome said.

FBI spokeswoman Beth Anne Steele could not comment on specific security measures for the holiday.

"We don't talk about security issues," she said. "If we did, it wouldn't be security."
