Willamette National Forest sees 'high' fire danger
 At midnight Monday, the U.S. Department of Agriculture Forest Service moved The Willamette National Forest's public awareness level to "High" fire danger. With the level shift comes certain use restrictions, such as absolutely no vehicular travel off of forest development roads — roads

constructed for automotive use. Other restrictions include no campfires, no smoking unless in enclosed vehicles on roads and no fireworks or any kind of pyrotechnic devices. Campfires are allowed in official campgrounds.
 The motivation for the level shift was lack of precipitation, Forest Service spokeswoman Patti Rodgers said. Use restrictions were not necessarily put in place because of existing fires in the

Willamette National Forest, but rather, "to keep people out of areas where the potential for accidental fires is high," Rodgers said.
 Rodgers does not anticipate the danger level lowering until Oregon receives a large amount of rain. The amount needed will not likely pour down until early fall.

 The new store will have a full-service bakery, florist and deli, and will include some unusual

features such as a Starbucks coffee stand and a sushi bar. And, according to a press release, the expanded store is expected to generate 50 new jobs.
 Neighbors, however, had mixed feelings about the renovation. Dorothy Lundquist, who lives a few blocks from the Oak Street location, said she would usually bypass the older store in favor of the larger, more modern 40th Avenue and Donald Street location. She said that she would probably become a patron of the new store, but also said she didn't like the fact that Safeway is now in competition with Hiron.
 "Hiron has benefited Safeway over the years, whether Safeway

realizes it or not," she said.
 Chuck Yenter, a regular customer at Hiron, was less concerned about the opening of the new pharmacy.
 "They have a right to do it if they want to," he said.
 The remodeled Safeway is scheduled to open for business at 6 a.m. Wednesday, with Oregon Lottery tickets to be given away to the first 600 customers. The grand re-opening activities will continue on Sept. 18 with a number of prize drawings, including an opportunity to win free groceries for a year.
