

Junior tailback Onterrio Smith, who rushed for 1,079 yards this season despite missing three of the final four games with a knee injury, was named by coaches to the All Pac-10 First Team. Senior Keenan Howry, as a punt returner, and sophomore kicker Jared Siegel were also named to the first team.
