In the same poll, Hunt moved up to No. 18 at the 141 weight class. Hunt won both his matches Friday by pinning his opponent. He moved up from No. 20 after being ranked there for two weeks.


Against Arizona, Lavin tried to spark the Bruins by substituting his starters for four bench-warmers with 13 minutes left in the second half.
