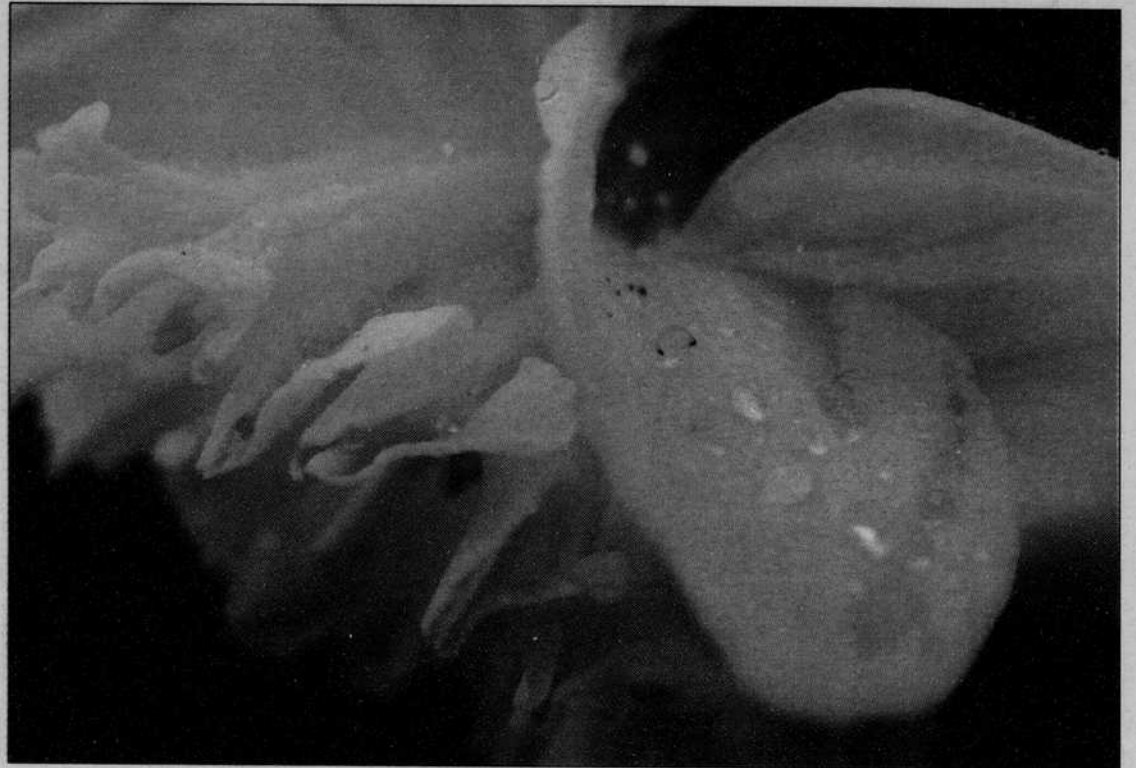




Flowers in the sun
