

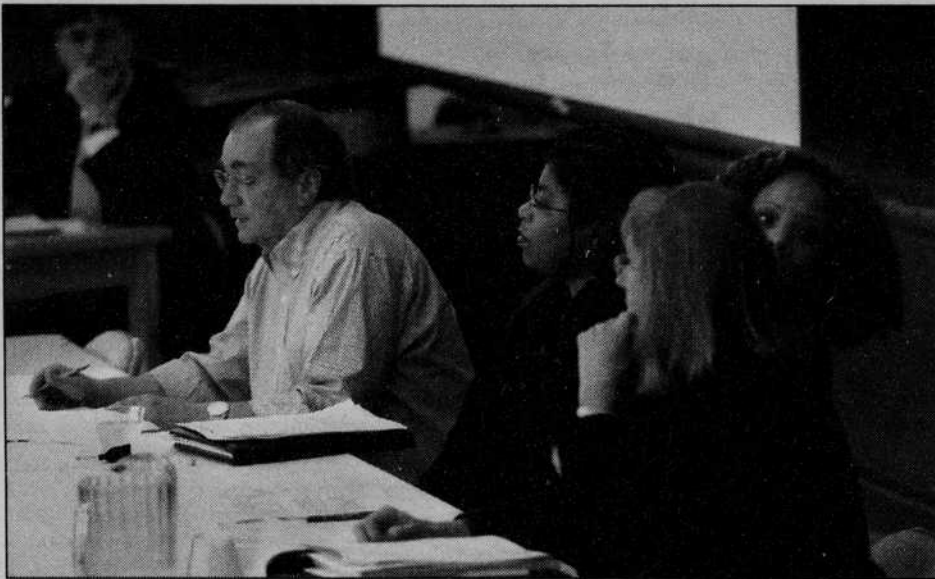

She said that although more minority faculty teach at the University now than before, things could be better.

"We've made some significant improvements, but we have to ask ourselves if this is where we want to be," Daugherty said. "I don't believe it is."

The panel also addressed the issue of creating a friendly environment for minority faculty on campus. Jayna Brown, an English professor, said one of the problems minority faculty face is feeling isolated.

"I've spoken with other faculty members of color who've voiced

frustration about alienation, isolation and even overt hostility," Brown said. "One of the focuses should be to keep people here."

Brown and other faculty are creating the Faculty and Staff of Color Coalition, which would work to address barriers to achieving diversity. One way to encourage diversity would be to work on curricula within departments that attract more minority applicants, she said.

Some senate members wondered whether sexual orientation would be considered in determining diversity. Daugherty said while it was not part of federally executed criteria, the University should include sexual orientation when measuring the pro-

gram's progress.


"It should be a part of the University's commitment to diversity," she said.

In other meeting business, Senate President Greg McLaughlan said he had not received a majority of Senate votes needed to revisit the topic of the war in Iraq. Twenty-two senate members have voted to revisit the issue and possibly draft another resolution, but 24 total votes are needed before the Senate can take any further action. McLaughlan said he would still accept votes from senate members who have not responded.


