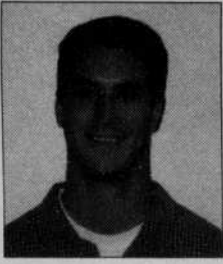
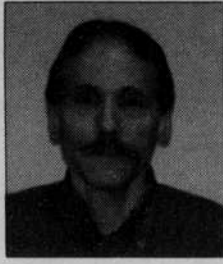

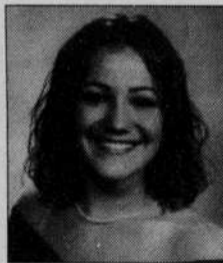
Prior to returning to graduate school I was an attorney. Through operating my law office for a number of years, gained experience with all aspects of running a business.

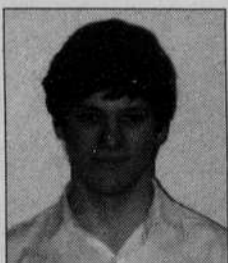

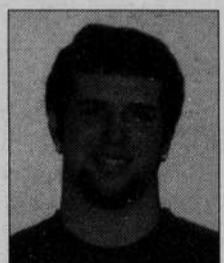
