## 'Dance 2003' to provide taste of dance faculty fare

The University's Department of Dance encompasses a wide array of movement styles, and this weekend's annual faculty-choreographed concert, "Dance 2003," will offer up a colorful sampling of the dancers' fare.

Dance Assistant Professor Walter Kennedy will present two of the evening's nine works. One piece, inspired by the Hubble Telescope and called "solo study for The Deep Field," is a fast-paced solo Kennedy choreographed especially for senior dance major Marlena Oden, set to contemporary music by Talvin Singh.

"It's a very physically demanding solo for a very highly skilled, beautiful dancer," Kennedy said.

Kennedy will present a reconstructed piece originally choreographed by Bella Lewitzky in 1994, entitled "META4." Kennedy will perform in the quartet, along with husband and wife graduate dance students Corrie Cowart and Tim Cowart and graduate dance student Sarah Ebert.

"It runs a wide range of moods," Kennedy said.

Kennedy added that the show will include choreography from Department of Dance Associate Professor Emerita Janet Descutner, who is retiring after more than 30 years at the University. Descutner's "On an Unwritten Letter" was inspired by a Eugenio Montale poem.

Kennedy also noted adjunct dance instructor Amy Impellizzeri's duet "In Her Spine," which integrates a low-hung swing as a performance highlight.

Kennedy added that the concert will be entertaining for avid dance fans as well as newcomers.

"It's going to be a really good show," he said. "It will be a good introduction to many different

kinds of contemporary dance for those who are curious."

Performaces take place today, Friday and Saturday at 8 p.m. at the Frances M. Dougherty Dance Theatre, located in Gerlinger Annex. Tickets are \$5 for students and seniors and \$10 for the general public, available at the door. The theater opens at 7:30 p.m., and Kennedy said patrons should arrive early because performances often sell out quickly.
