Young women's squad ends season disappointed

Despite not making the NCAA Regionals or the NCAA Championships, head coach Shannon Rouillard is optimistic about how things are yet to play out for the women's team.

"When you have a young team, there are going to be some ups and downs," Rouillard said. "We are in the process of rebuilding the program."

It was senior Annie Davis, junior Lacy Erickson, sophomores Jess Carlyon and Johnna Nealy and freshmen

Therese Wenslow, Erin Andrews and Michelle Timpani that traveled to most of the season's tournaments. The team was one of the youngest in the Pacific-10 Conference.


Nealy and Wenslow constantly battled for the No. 1 spot, proving just how young the team was.


