Service Corps Fellow Laura Don said. Don added that Levey was well-known among students and will be missed.

"He always had a wonderful energy and a positive attitude," she said. She remembers Levey for his creativity, noting that he once made some beautiful ceramic candlesticks and a spice box during a Judaica-making session. Apart from being an ardent hiker, Levey also loved to run, his friends said. Don said he recently completed a marathon in Wisconsin.

Friends say Levey trained hard for the marathons, and that it seemed whenever he put his mind to something he would go all out to work for it. For instance, in 2000 he and his friend Eric Lam stayed up for 100 hours straight to raise money for the Ronald McDonald house.

Levey was buried Monday at the Mililani Memorial Park and Mortuary. He is survived by his mother and father, Joyce and Norman Levey, and a younger sister, Sara. A memorial will be held at 8 p.m. Sunday at Chabad of Eugene at 1307 E. 19th Ave.

Upon hearing of her son's death Friday, Joyce Levey said in a news conference in Hawaii that her son "died doing what he enjoyed."

Galinsky said Levey never let anything put him down. His favorite phrase was "Gam zulla tova" — which means "This is also for the good" — accepting that whatever happens is for a good reason.

"I'm sure wherever he is now, this isn't getting him down," Galinsky said. "He took advantage of life. He lived life to the fullest."
