

does not require a keyboard or pen or typewriter. This is because all humans are drawn to expression, and it's time to once again make expression a priority in our lives. "The people fancy they hate poetry, and they are all poets and mystics," Emerson says. Find poetry in the lowest, the highest and all the gray in between - if you are a preacher, teacher, busboy or barista. "The

poorest experience is rich enough for all the purposes of expressing thought," Emerson notes.


and a karaoke competition, as well as two food-related competitions: a Rice Crispy sculpture contest and a watermelon-seed spitting contest

Fair-going means food, and the Lane County Fair certainly delivers. Vendors this year include Ben & Jerry's, Brindiamo Catering, The Great Philly Steak, Mission Mexican Restaurant, Wild Duck Pizza, Jumbo Burrito, Oriental Village and Cordy's Country BBQ.

With a mix of new and classic rides, the fair will not be short on mechanically induced excitement, either. There are 17 rides for adults, including classics like the Zipper and Super Loops, as well as new rides like the Invertor and the Scrambler. For kids there are the Haunted House, the Convoy and the Space Train.

The fair will open every day at 11:00 am. Daily admission is \$8 for those 16 and older and \$6 for those six to 15. Children five and younger get in free. Season passes — good for all six days - are available for \$15. Tickets are available at the gate. Reserved-seating concert tickets are available for \$12.50 to \$16.50 and can be purchased through TicketsWest/Fastixx outlets, or at the Lane Ice Center at the Fairgrounds. Concert tickets do not include fair admission.
