day-to-day operations of the facility.

Similarly, the Athletic Department Finance Committee has the responsibility of allocating money to the athletic department in exchange for student tickets.

The Student Senate, which is composed of 18 student senators, confirms the budget distributed by the three groups allocating the money.

The Constitutional Court's job is to get involved when something goes wrong. For example, the five members of the court, who are chosen by

the Executive president and confirmed by the Senate, mediate any grievances that occur within the ASUO. Also, it deals with election disputes, and monitors ASUO branches and programs.

Finally, the Associated Student Presidential Advisory Committee is responsible for updating and informing University President Dave Frohnmayer about events that may concern students. The group is composed of 16 representatives from a wide variety of programs and departments.

"We hope to offer courses for a broad range of students who might have special interests," George said. She added that the organization also wants to work with professors and departments to facilitate special study programs that cater to particular academic needs.

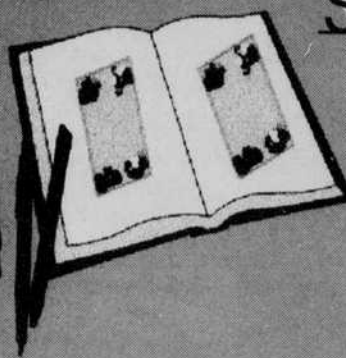
