Theater performances and concerts can provide both a welcome distraction from the daily grind of classes and a bit more sophistication than a weekend keg party, and the Eugene area features one of the best venues for such art.

The Hult Center is home to Eugene's opera, ballet and symphony, and also attracts larger, national acts. While the center is mostly associated with the central downtown's highly visible Silva Concert Hall, the Hult Center also includes the Cuthbert Amphitheater, the Soreng Theater and the Jacobs Gallery.
