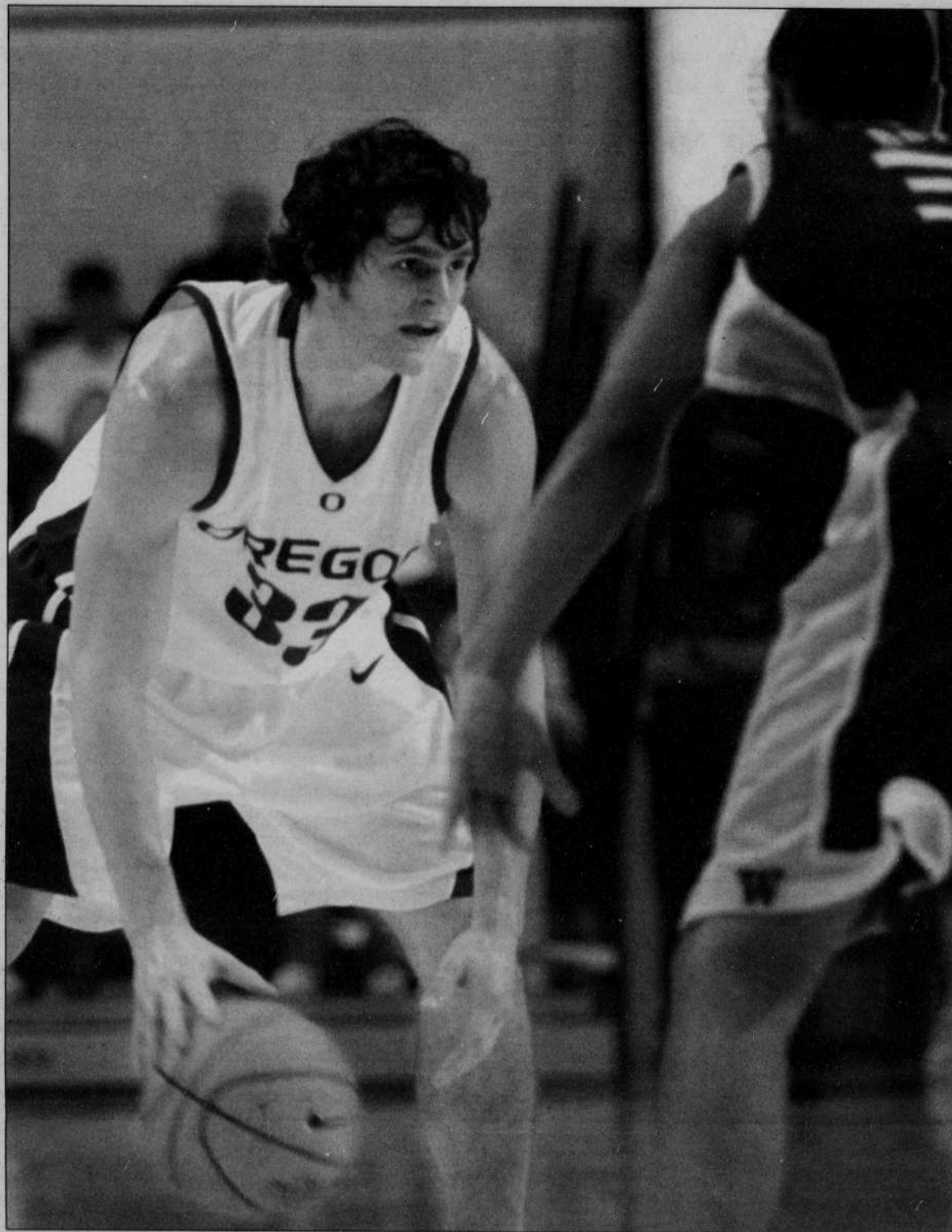

Last year, Oregon made headway by winning the Pac-10 Tournament in March, giving it an automatic berth into the postseason.

Until the day comes when Oregon can restart, the Ducks will continue to call McArthur Court home. That's not an omen. There's nothing to take out

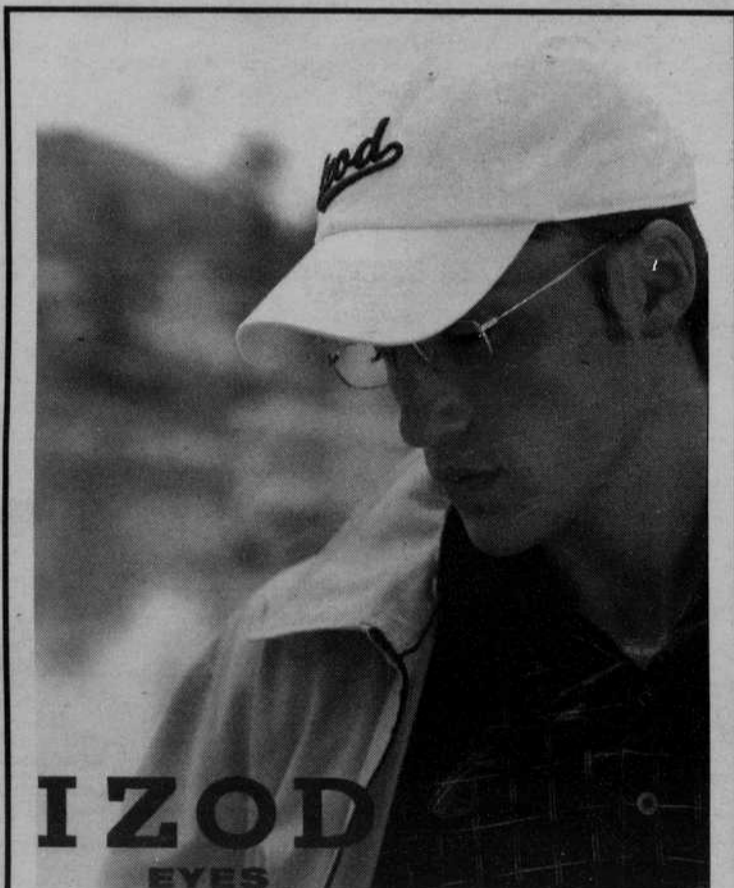
of that.
