for her third term representing the area.

"I think it's important to have someone on the council who represents ordinary people, the interests of the environment and the interests of citizen participation," she said. "Always environmental protection is number one for me."

Taylor said she will continue to protect open spaces, promote citizen participation and work to acquire stream corridors.

Running against her is Washington Elementary School Principal Maurice Denner.

He said he frames most of his concerns — including clean air and water, living-wage jobs and public safety — from the perspective of an advocate for children.

"If we're doing a good job of providing for our kids, we're doing a good job of providing for their parents, their grandparents and future generations," he said.

Ward 7

Ward 7 includes parts of downtown, along with the Whiteaker, Trainsong and River Road neighborhoods.

Incumbent Scott Meisner said his campaign is driven by the fact that he has not accomplished all the goals he had when he first took office in 1997.

His essential goals include economic development, downtown revitalization, organized city government planning, stable funding for public safety, and protecting parks and open spaces.


Meisner said that he felt confident about what he had accomplished thus far as a councilor.

His opponent, Andrea Ortiz, however, expressed concern about the direction of the council's efforts.


"I feel like the community voice isn't being heard," she said.

Ortiz, who is a Bethel School District board member and volunteers on the Eugene Human Rights Com-



mission, said one of her main concerns is the future of the Trainsong neighborhood if the railroad and industrialization is allowed to overwhelm the area.

She said she also wants to strengthen neighborhood identity, promote homeownership and improve the treatment of the homeless and the underserved.

Ward 8

Ward 8 encompasses the Churchill area, some of Highway 99 and borders West Eugene out to Green Hill Road.

Chris Pryor, public affairs manager for the Willamalane Parks and Recre-

ation District, is running unopposed to represent that ward.

Pryor has served on the 4J School District board for the past 11 years, has worked with the Eugene Area Chamber of Commerce and has volunteered for United Way of America. He said he has also studied and taught leadership for many years.

He said the key to a working city is a balance between quality of life and quality of livelihood, which includes living-wage jobs.

as a whole, which also violates section 12.1 of the ASUO Constitution.

"Providing every member of the University of Oregon student body with the least burdensome, most convenient elections process is simply an impossibility," Yoshida wrote. "The majority ... seems to be unduly concerned with the potentially adverse educational affects on a relatively small segment of the overall student body, the University of Oregon law school community."

"Whether it be law students, graduate students, political science majors, business majors, or any other segment of the overall student body, the elections process may work an incidental ... harm or inconvenience to a particular student group."

With the Court's latest rejection of the proposed election dates, Day said she will be forced to schedule the election during a weekend, which is something that has never been done before. Day is now proposing the primary take place April 12 through April 14, and the general be moved up to April 16 through April 19.

Day said it will be difficult for the Elections Board to work with these dates and to attract student voters who aren't on campus during the weekends, but they will do what they can to raise awareness.

"We're going to do what we were hired to do, which is hold an election" she said. "It's just really disappointing when you're working with leaders who don't have the same priorities you do."
