Arizona were both put into positions to succeed.

No. 1 Stanford (29-1 overall) vs. No. 16 Texas San-Antonio (20-12)

A day after avenging a loss to Washington with a win over the Huskies in the Pac-10 Tournament, Stanford earned the No. 1 seed in the Phoenix section of the tournament.

"We wanted to avenge our only loss of the season," Stanford's Josh Childress told reporters after the game. "I was fired up. I'm definitely glad we got to play them again."

Childress reigns as the Pac-10's Player of the Year and is joined by a morethan-competent cast. Matt Lottich, Joe Kirchofer and Justin Davis, among others, all have played key roles this season.

One thing was apparent after Sunday's NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament selection show: The Pacific-10 Conference isn't considered one of the


Only three teams from the
