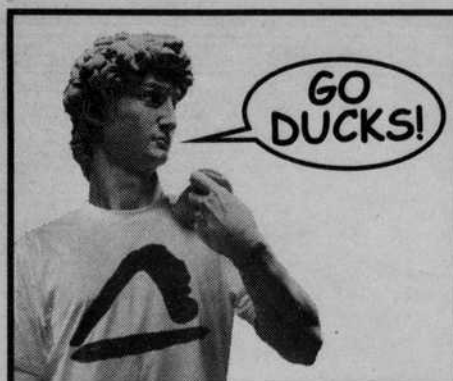

After the talent show, the chairs were moved, and the remaining audience members danced until 11 p.m.

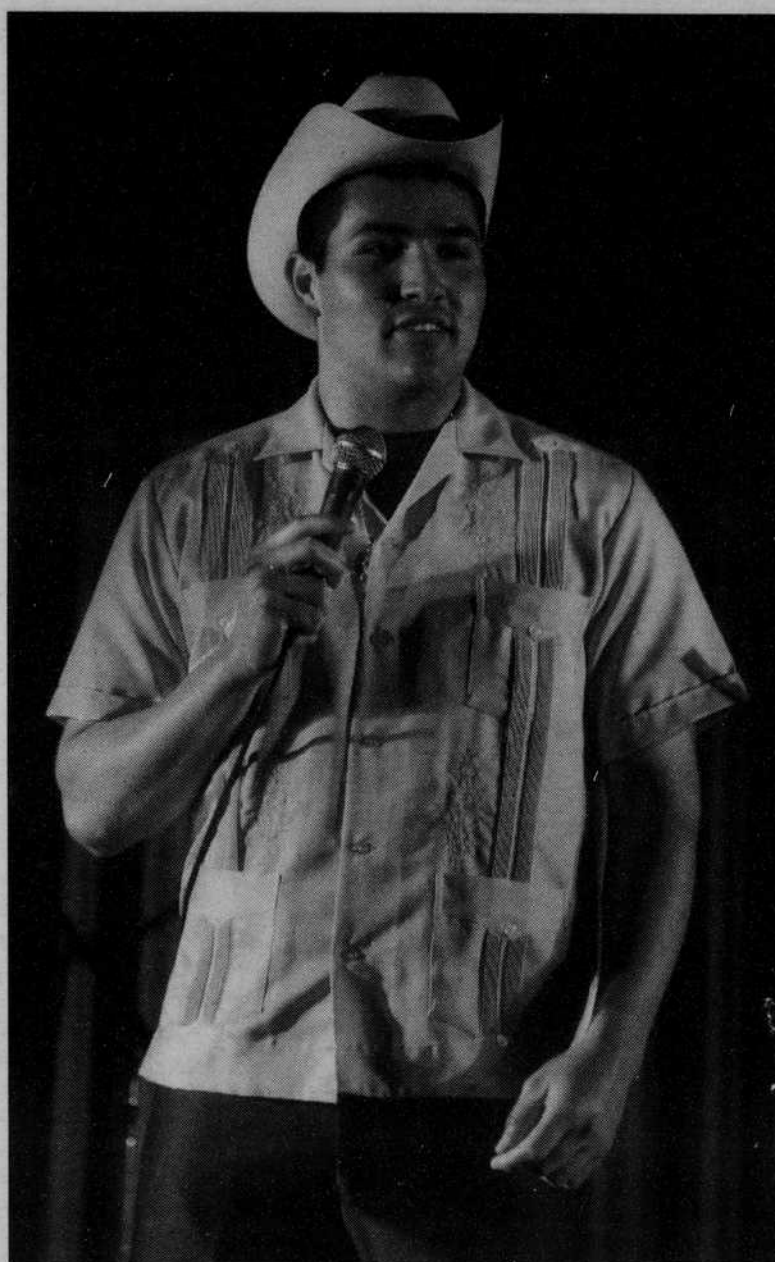
