

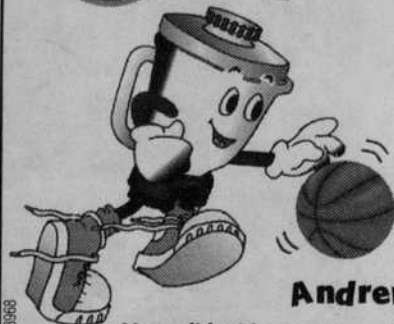

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techniques. Members can compete in casting distance and precision, or they can compete to catch the same squirrel, he added.

He said about 30 students are currently in the club, but as the word spreads, and if the club gets sponsored, he expects about 100 people would be interested in joining. He said with the base funding that initial sponsorship would provide, the club could make T-shirts to use for fundraising.

McIlhenny said the West Coast has a strong history of squirrel fishing, and one of the largest clubs currently resides at University of California, Berkeley, which has 84 members, including faculty and staff. With a number of other clubs competing, including those found at University of California, Santa Barbara and the University of Arizona, he said there would be plenty of opportunities to compete.

While some students use the sport to practice for traditional fly fishing, McIlhenny said that's not his intention for the club.

"I don't do it for that," he said. "I do it to squirrel fish."
