Glasper. Two current Ducks also attended De La Salle: senior defensive back Charles Favroth and junior wide receiver Demetrius Williams.

Oregon defensive coordinator Nick Aliotti said Kelly was a great person who was looking forward to beginning college life on the field and in the classroom at Oregon.

"He was just a sweetheart of a kid," Aliotti said. "He was a great young man who had some special goals and aspirations to come to Oregon and be a fantastic linebacker and student

here at the University. He and his family were very proud of the opportunity and Terrance was looking for great things to happen for him here."

The 6-foot-1, 215-pound Kelly was expected to compete for a starting spot at linebacker that was vacated by the departures of Kevin Mitchell and David Martin.

At De La Salle, Kelly was one of the school's top athletes and helped the program to 151 straight victories. He played a variety of positions including tailback, tight end, linebacker and safety.

As a senior, Kelly rushed for a league-leading 1,014 yards (9.2 yards per carry) and 16 touchdowns, along with 17 receptions for 287 yards and two touchdowns.

On defense, he ranked second in the team in tackles, recording 122, in addition to three receptions and one fumble recovery.

Kelly was known as an intelligent athlete who utilized his speed and strength.

His death is the first of an Oregon athlete with remaining eligibility since basketball player Jesse Nash drowned in the Willamette River in a swimming accident in May of 1987.

Kelly's funeral is scheduled in Richmond, Calif., for this morning and will be attended by Bellotti, Aliotti, Williams, assistant coach Don Pllum and outside linebacker Anthony Trucks.
