Tuition: Administrators say tuition increases plausible

campaign but added that it would be difficult to pass a tuition freeze.

"I think that it's definitely a challenge, but I think it recognizes that we can no longer afford to fund higher education on the backs of students," he said.

The last mandated tuition freeze passed in 1999 and was effective through 2001. The lobbying efforts of OSA helped pass the bill.

However, with the state in a budget crunch, university administrators have said tuition is likely to continue increasing to try to mitigate the shortfall. This summer the State Board of Higher Education recommended a 5 percent tuition increase for each year

of the 2005-2007 biennium; the board will make final approvals to tuition increases by summer 2005. University Vice President and Vice Provost John Moseley said the tuition increases instituted this fall were necessary to maintain course availability and other student services, according to a June 7, 2004 Emerald article.

VonReis-Iglesias called the rising tuition rates "ridiculous," and said she hoped a tuition freeze passed.

"(The governor) should understand that students need an education to be successful," she said. "I don't understand why he wouldn't want everyone to have that opportunity."
