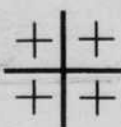

Sven Swinnen loses in second round of NCAA's

Sven Swinnen's bid for a national
championship came to an end
Thursday at the 2005 NCAA Division
I Men's Tennis Championships in
College Station, Texas.

The 6-foot-3 senior came up short
in his second-round match against
Florida State's Mat Cloer, which
ended in three sets, 6-3, 3-6, 6-2. Swinnen
fell behind early after losing the first
set, but came back to lead 3-0 in the
second. In the third set, Swinnen lost
the first three games and couldn't re-
cover to advance to the third round of
the 64-player tournament.

Swinnen previously faced Cloer on
Jan. 15 in Honolulu when the Ducks
played Florida State. Swinnen defeat-
ed Cloer, 7-5, 6-7, 6-4.

Swinnen, 24, ends his career at
Oregon atop the all-time career sin-
gles victories list with 84. He also
leads the Ducks with a school-record
26 singles wins this season.

In last season's NCAA Tourna-
ment, Swinnen bowed out in the first
round when he lost to Rice Universi-
ty's William Barker, 6-2, 6-1.

The Oregon men's tennis team did
not live up to its expectations this sea-
son behind Swinnen, fellow senior
Manuel Kost, and first-year head
coach Kevin Kowalik. The Ducks end-
ed with an 8-15 overall record, win-
ning just one of their seven Pacific-10
Conference matches.

thing I have always considered."

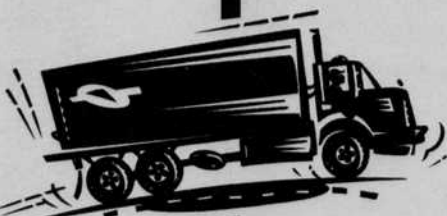
The 2005 Men's Golf Champi-
