#### Microsoft admits popular MSN site hacked in Korea

WASHINGTON Microsoft Corp. acknowledged Thursday that hackers booby-trapped its popular MSN Web site in South Korea to try to steal passwords from visitors. The company said it was unclear how many Internet users might have been victimized.

Microsoft said it cleaned the Web site, www.msn.co.kr, and removed the dangerous software code that unknown hackers had added earlier this week. A spokesman, Adam Sohn, said Microsoft was confident its English-language Web sites were not vulnerable to the same type of attack.

South Korea is a leader in highspeed Internet users worldwide. Microsoft's MSN Web properties which offer news, financial advice, car- and home-buying information and more - are among the most popular across the Web.

The affected Microsoft site in South Korea offers news and other information plus links to the company's free e-mail and search services. Its English-language equivalent is the default home Internet page for the newest versions of its flagship Windows software sold in the United States.

The Korean site, unlike U.S. versions, was operated by another company Microsoft did not identify. Microsoft's own experts and Korean police authorities were investigating, but Microsoft believes the computers were vulnerable because operators failed to apply necessary software patches, Sohn said.

# Earthquake! Explore Oregon this summer with classes

at Klamath Community College in the high desert in southeastern Oregon.

Field Geography: Explore the Klamath Basin from Crater Lake to the Wildlife Refuges to the Sprague River headwaters in this 2-week class. In 5 class sessions and 2 all-day trips, students will learn firsthand about the impact of human activity on southern Oregon's earth, air, and water, learn map-reading and map-making skills and keep field journals of their explorations.

Pacific Northwest Geology: Explore various geologic features in Oregon in this 4-week class. In 8 class and field sessions, students will learn basic geology terms and theories, make a number of field trips to Oregon features such as volcanoes and fossil beds, and keep field journals of their explorations.

Oregon Trail: Learn about "Oregon Fever" and the massive migration of people from the East to our state in this 8-week class. Klamath Falls is located along the Applegate Cutoff portion of the Oregon Trail.
