To Save One Life a Day.

"We will save thirty lives in thirty days, said Superintendent W. E. Watt, who is in charge of the experiment. "We are planning for ten additional schools of this kind, and we will keep the children out here in the open until severe cold compels us to withdraw for the season.

"We will soon have all the infected children segregated and will teach them how to battle with the disease. We feel certain that almost all the cases can be cured. Of course this condition cannot be brought about at once. This season we hope to strengthen the children, harden them and increase their power of resistance. Early in the spring they will return to tent life again, and the work will continue." The children adapted themselves quickly to the routine of camp. The little girls took up the work of washing dishes and scrubbing kitchen utensils in a way which bespoke previous experience at home. The boys assisted the girls with the heavier work. The parents are very enthusiastic.

Sleighbells on Automobiles. 
