#### Ordinance No. 139

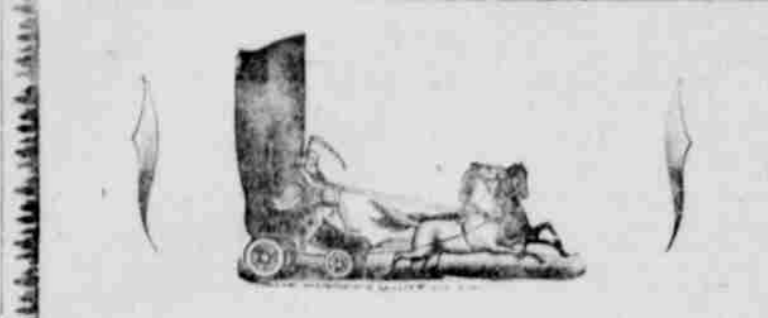
An ordinance apportioning the cost of the improvement of Casenau street in the City of St. Helens, Oregon, between the northerly boundary line of Willamette street and the westerly extension of the northerly boundary line of lot 6 in block 16 of said city, by grading the same for the full width thereof, and assessing the cost of said improvement to the property benefited thereby.

Whereas Ordinance No. 130 was on the 9th day of September, 1912, duly and regularly passed by the common council of the City of St. Helens, Oregon, and approved on the same day by the mayor of said city, wherein and whereby it was ordered that all that portion of Casenau street in the City of St. Helens, Oregon, lying between the northerly boundary line of Willamette street and the westerly extension of the northerly boundary line of lot 6 in block 16 of said city, be improved by grading the same; and that in accordance with the provisions of said ordinance said portion of said Casenau street has been so improved at a cost of \$24,82, which has been duly and regularly ascertained, in accordance with the provisions of the charter and ordinances of said city, and for which the said city has not been reimbursed;

And whereas, under the charter of said city and said ordinance No. 130, it is required and directed that the cost of such improvement shall fall upon the property abutting thereon, to-wit: Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6, all in block 16, and lots 17, 18, 19, 20, 21 and 22, all in block 28, all of the above being in the said City of St. Helens, Oregon, and that such cost and the whole thereof be apportioned upon the above described real property according to the value of the real estate only, as determined by the last previous county assessment.

Now, therefore, in accordance with the provisions of said charter and ordinance, the City of St. Helens does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That said sum of \$24,82 be and the same hereby is apportioned among the owners of said lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 in block 16, and lots 17, 18, 19, 20, 21 and 22 in block 28, all in the City of St. Helens, Oregon, and against the lots respectively, according to the value of the real estate only, as determined by the last previous assessment, so determined.
