Ordinance No. 150

An ordinance declaring the intention of the Common Council of the City of St. Helens, Oregon, to establish a sewer system within sewer district No. 7, of said city, and the necessity thereof; showing the location of the same; the material out of which the said sewer shall be constructed; appointing appraisers or arbitrators to appraise the probable costs etc., and providing for notice to property owners.

Whereas, the city engineer of the city of St. Helens, Oregon, has divided said city into sewer districts, in accordance with the natural topography of the several additions, blocks and lots comprising said city, of which the hereinafter described district is and shall be known as Sewer District No. 7, of said city, and in relation thereto has furnished such recommendations, maps and illustrations as are needed for the guidance of the common council of said city;

And whereas said district embraces a large number of inhabitant and residents, and is utterly without any system of sewerage or drainage;

And whereas, there is grave apprehension of an epidemic of sickness from the want of proper sewer facilities in said district;

And whereas, it is obvious to the common council of said city and to the city health officer thereof, that a sewerage system is necessary for the health and convenience of the city and its inhabitants, and especially of that portion of said city embraced in said district and the residents thereof;

Now, therefore, The City of St. Helens does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That in pursuance of Chapter XI, of the charter of the city of St. Helens, Oregon, relating to sewers and drains, the city engineer of said city has divided the said city into sewer districts and has numbered the same consecutively in accordance with the natural topography of the several additions, blocks and lots composing said city, and among others has numbered and designated one as Sewer District No. 3, of said city, the boundaries of which are as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the northwest corner of Block 48, St. Helens, Oregon, and running thence southerly along the east

line of Hemlock street, 791 feet; thence westerly and parallel to St. Helens street, 180 feet to the common corner of lots 10, 11, 12 and 13, block 58 of St. Helens; thence southerly at right angles 116 feet, thence westerly and parallel with St. Helens street 250 feet, to the common corner of lots 8, 9, 14 and 15 of Block 65 of St. Helens; thence southerly at right angles, 38 feet to the corner of lots 7, 8, 15 and 16 of block 65; thence westerly and parallel to St. Helens street, 380 feet to the east line of Pacific street; thence northerly on the east line of Pacific street, 116 feet; thence westerly and parallel to St. Helens street, 180 feet; thence northerly and parallel to Pacific street 156 feet; thence westerly at right angles to Pacific street, 140 feet; thence northerly and parallel to Pacific street, 355.5 feet; thence easterly at right angles 240 feet to an intersection with the west line of Pacific street, thence northerly along the west line of Pacific street, 30 feet to the northeast corner of block 80 of St. Helens; thence westerly on the southerly line of Willamette street, 200 feet to the northwest corner of said block 80; thence northerly on the east line of Bond street, 312 feet; thence easterly and parallel to Willamette street, 800 feet to the center of Walla Walla street; thence southerly along the center of Walla Walla street, 174 feet; thence easterly and parallel to Willamette street, 140 feet to the common corner of lots 1, 2, 21 and 22 of block 60 of St. Helens; thence northerly at right angles, 58 feet to the common corner of lots 2, 3, 20 and 21 of said block 60; thence easterly and parallel to Willamette street, 140 feet to the center of Hemlock street; thence southerly on the center line of Hemlock street, 196 feet to a point in the south line of Willamette street; and thence easterly 40 feet to the place of beginning, containing 126 lots and said sewer district shall henceforth be known as sewer district No. 7 of said city.

It is hereby declared that a sewerage system within said sewer district is necessary for the health and convenience of said city and its inhabitants, and especially is it necessary for the health and convenience of said sewer district No. 7 and the residents and inhabitants thereof; and it is the intention of the common council of said city to establish a sewer system therein because of such necessity;

Section 3. That the location of said sewer, with its laterals and branches, will be as shown on the plan submitted by J. A. McQuinn, city engineer, to the common council, and filed with the recorder of said city May 22nd, 1913;

Section 4. That the sewer pipe will be of glazed, vitrified clay, and the sub-drain, wherever used, will be of drain tile, the size of which, together with a particular description of all other material can be ascertained by an inspection of the specifications filed with the said city recorder on May 22nd, 1913, and made a part hereof;

Section 5. That W. J. Fullerton, J. Q. Gage and H. P. Ross are hereby appointed appraisers and arbitrators to make the appraisal of the probable costs of said sewerage system among all the real estate owners in said district, in accordance with the provisions of the city charter, as well as to perform such other duties as are required of them, thereunder.

Section 6. That notice shall be given by the city recorder, for two successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in said city and by posting, for the same length of time, in three public places in said city, definitely fixing the time and place of meeting to be held by the common council of said city for the purpose of hearing any and all complaints by or on the part of any and all property owners within the limits of said district, and all persons whose property is so affected shall have the right to appear and make and file their objections to the locations of the boundaries of the district, or other objections to such improvements; and the said council shall have the power under this ordinance to make such alterations as it shall deem in accordance with justice and for the best interests of said city.

Beginning at the northwest corner of block 80, in said city of St. Helens and running thence northerly along the east line of Bond street 602 feet; thence westerly and parallel to Willamette street, 190 feet to the common corner of lots 9, 10, 13 and 14 of block 92 of said city, thence southerly and parallel with Bond street, 232 feet to the common corner of lots 5, 6, 17 and 18 of said block 92; thence westerly and parallel with Willamette street, 420 feet to the center line of Pine street, thence northerly on the center line of Pine street, 348 feet to the south line of Wyeth street, thence westerly on the south line of Wyeth street, 420 feet; thence southerly at right angles to Wyeth street 116 feet to the common corner of lots 9, 10, 13 and 14, of block 111 in said city, thence westerly and parallel with Wyeth street, 280 feet to the corner of lots 9, 10, 13 and 14 in block 124 of said city; thence northerly at right angles 602 feet to the common corner of lots 7, 8, 15 and 16 in block 125 of said city; thence westerly at right angles 528 feet to the east line of the S. Bids will be received by the County Court of Columbia County, Oregon, at the office of the County Clerk of said county, up to and until 10 o'clock a. m. of Saturday, June 7th, 1913, for the construction of a steel bridge across Beaver Creek in Road District No. 8; length of span 40 feet, to be supported by concrete abutments of about 9 feet in height, but said abutments must be of sufficient height so that they will rest upon a solid foundation, and to make the bridge conform to the grade of the road, plans and specifications to be submitted by the bidder; also for the construction of a combination bridge across the East Fork of the Nehalem river at Pittsburg, Ore., in road district No. 14; length of span 100 feet, with an approach of 10 feet on one end and of 20 feet on the other end; said span to be supported by steel cylinders to be filled with concrete, the height of said cylinders to be about 20 feet, but must be of sufficient length so

refuses, for a period of two days after such award is made, to enter into the contract and file his bond in the manner required by and to the satisfaction of the county court. The county court reserves the right to reject any and all bids.
