While the first week or two in August are considered the best time for sowing alfalfa in the territory east of the one hundredth meridian, the spring sowing is recommended in all that area usually known as the dry belt, and the best results are had if the tract on which the seed is sowed was summer fallowed the year before.

In Ireland the co-operative idea has taken firm root. Since the beginning of the movement twenty-four years ago it has grown until today there are 905 societies, with a total membership of 97,000. In 1911 the volume of business transacted amounted to about \$12,059,107, while the amount of business done since the movement started reaches the total of \$136,080,000.
