Court came pursuant to call of adjournment. Officers all present except Commissioner Fluhrer. Due proclamation being made the following proceedings were had: Matter of petition of J. G. Watts et al for relocation of J. P. West road: On this day this matter coming on to be heard upon the second reading of the report of the board of county road viewers, which said report was publicly read on two different days of this term of court and no remonstrance or petition for damages being filed, and the court being satisfied that such road will be of public utility and the report of the viewers being favorable thereto, it is ordered by the court that said report, survey, profile and plat be recorded in suitable books kept for that purpose, and from thenceforth said road shall be a public highway. It is further ordered by the court that the road supervisor in whose

district said road is located shall open the same for public travel. Matter of application of City of Rainier for rental of rock crusher: On this 3rd day of July, 1913, this matter coming on for consideration upon the application of the city of Rainier by F. J.
