Due proclamation being made the following proceedings were had:
Matter of application of Ina Burns for widow's pension:
On this 8th day of November, 1913, there is presented to the court an order of the juvenile court of this county, allowing a widow's pension in the sum of \$32.50 per month in favor of said Ina Burns in accordance with Chapter 42, S. L. 1913, and the court being advised in the matter it is ordered that the clerk be and he is hereby instructed to issue a general fund warrant in the sum of \$33.50 in favor of said Ina Burns and a like warrant on the first day of each month hereafter, until the further order of this court.

Matter of application of Christine Carlson for widow's pension. On this 8th day of November, 1913, there is presented to the court an order of the juvenile court of this county, allowing a widow's pension in the sum of \$10.00 per month in favor of Christine Carlson in accordance with Chapter 42, S. L. 1913, and the court being advised in the matter, it is ordered by the court that the clerk be and he is hereby instructed to issue a general fund warrant in the sum of \$10.00 in favor of said Christine Carlson and a like warrant on the first day of each month hereafter, until the further order of this court. Matter of purchase of burial tract: On this day it is ordered by the court that the clerk be and is hereby authorized and instructed to issue a general fund warrant in favor of St. Helens Lodge No. 117 in the sum of \$100.00 on receipt of a deed duly executed by said Lodge and approved by the county judge conveying to Columbia county a certain tract of land for burial purposes.

Matter of petition of J. N. Rice for tax rebate:

On this day comes on for hearing the petition of J. N. Rice for tax rebate on account of alleged excessive timber cruise on a certain 50 acre tract in section 10-7-4 and the court not being fully advised in the matter, it is ordered by the court that said petition be and the same is hereby continued.

Matter of estimate of money to be raised by taxation for 1913 roll;

On this day it is ordered by the court that its itemized estimate of expenditures to be made from the moneys proposed to be raised by taxation for 1913, assessment roll as now made together with notice of the time and place of making such tax levy, be published in the county official newspapers, for two consecutive publications beginning Nov. 21, 1913, being as follows:

Notice is hereby given that on Friday, the 5th day of December, 1913, in the county court room in the City of St. Helens, a meeting of the County Court will be held for the purpose of levying taxes to defray probable expenses of the county, and that at said time and place any taxpayer subject to such tax levy when made, may be heard in favor or against any proposed tax levies as may be required to raise the amounts as shown by the itemized estimate of contemplated expenditures from the moneys proposed to be raised by taxation, as made by the County Court, being as follows:

Current Expense—Books, stationery, postage, expressage, telephones, etc., all offices	5,000.00
Court House Expenses—Janitor, lights, water, fuel, repairs, supplies and fixtures	2,500.00
Jail—Board of prisoners, medical attendance, medicine, repairs, supplies and fixtures	1,200.00
Care of Poor—Salary of physician, poor farm, provisions, transportation, hospital charges, burials etc	4,000.00
Indigent Soldiers—Relief furnished	300.00
Insane—Examinations and expense	100.00
Election Expenses—Registrations, supplies, election boards, deputy sheriffs, etc	2,000.00
Roads and Highways—Road supervisors, surveying, view-ing, damages, road engineer etc	5,000.00
Fire Patrol—Protection of forest and state apportionment	900.00
County Fair—For buildings etc	1,000.00
Sealer of Weights and measures—Salary and supplies	700.00
Roads and Highways—For bridges, repairs, machinery, supplies and survey	60,000.00
