The dial is called a norizontal dial when the dial plane is on the plane of the horizon; a vertical dial when perpendicuinr to that plane. A dial whose plane is parallel to the equator is called an equinoctial dial. There are also north dials, south dials, east dials, west dials, potar dials, declining dials, etc .-Chicago Tribune.
