gor at the county court room in the county court house, at St. Helens, Columbia county, Oregon, on Wednesday April 1, 1914 at the hour of 2 o'clock p. m. for the sale of \$360,000.00 five per cent bonds of said county, in denominations of \$50.00 or multiples thereof, up to \$1000.00, at option of bidder, interest payable semi-annually at the office of the county treasurer of said county, or fiscal agency of the state of Oregon at New York City, New York, at option of bidder.

Said bonds to run the number of years each, as follows:

\$60,000.00 thereof to run for five years each.

\$100,000.00 thereof to run for ten years each.

\$100,000.00 thereof to run for fifteen years each.

\$100,000.00 thereof to run for twenty years each.

Each bid must be accompanied by a check in favor of Columbia county, certified to by a reputable solvent bank, in an amount equal to five per cent of the amount of bonds included in bid, this check to be returned if bid is rejected. If bid is accepted, check will be returned upon payment and delivery of bonds. If bid is accepted and amount of bid not paid within thirty (30) days, then check will become the property of the County.

Bids will be received for any amount of bonds.

The right to reject any and all bids, or to accept part and reject others is reserved to be county court.

Address all bids as follows: H. E. LaBare, County Clerk, St. Helens, Oregon, and endorse on envelope "Bid for Columbia County Bonds."

It is further ordered that beginning with the fourth year after such bonds are sold this court shall, each year thereafter until maturity of the bonds set aside as a special fund for the payment of said bonds, such percentage of the face value of such bonds as at the date of their maturity shall aggregate the full face value thereof, and since said bonds are issued in different series maturing at different times, special redemption funds shall be provided and created separately for each series of said bonds.

It is further ordered, that the amount necessary to provide such redemption funds, and to pay interest on such bonds shall be added to the general levy of taxes, as may be required, which taxes shall be levied upon all taxable property within said county.

Matter of petition of D C Smith, et al, for a county road:

On this 4th day of March, 1914, comes on for hearing the petition of D C Smith, et al, freeholders, residing in the road district or districts of said proposed road, praying for the establishment of a county road described as follows:

Beginning at a point 320 ft. e of the sw cor of lot 30, Beaver Homes, as per map or plat of same now of record in the office of the county recorder in and for said county and state; running thence in a southeasterly direction and terminating at a point in the Nicolai road about 800 feet nor east of where the said Nicolai road crosses the east line of Sec. 15, Tp 6 n R w, W M, about 1750 feet north of the se cor of said Sec 15.

And it satisfactorily appearing to the court from proof filed herein, that due notice of the pendency of this pro-

ceeding has been given as by law required that twelve of said petitioners are legal freeholders of this county, residing in the road district or districts of the proposed road, and that a good and sufficient bond has been given and filed herein;

It is therefore ordered by the court that the board of county road viewers meet at Goble, on the 16th day of March, 1914, or on their failure to meet on said day, then within five days thereafter, and proceed to view, survey and locate said proposed road.

Matter of claim of P A Frakes for indemnity for slaughtered cattle:

On this day P A Frakes presents to the court his claim for indemnity in the sum of \$367.50 for eleven registered cattle slaughtered under the provisions of Chapter 14, General Laws of 1913 and the court being advised in the matter, it is ordered by the court that a public hearing of said claim be held on Wednesday, April 1, 1914, at the hour of 10 o'clock a. m., at the county court room, for the purpose of determining whether said P A Frakes is entitled to receive said indemnity for said cattle and whether he has complied with all laws in regard thereto.

Matter of petition for aid for Briita Kinnunen:

On this day comes on for hearing that certain petition of Jos H Lumijarvi and thirteen others, residents and taxpayers of Columbia county, asking for aid for Briita Kinnunen, and the court being advised in the matter, it is ordered by the court that the clerk be, and he is hereby instructed to issue a General Fund Warrant in the sum of \$15.00 in favor of said Briita Kinnunen, and a like warrant on the first day of each month hereafter, until further order of the court.

Matter of petition of Anna Sandstrom for county aid:

On this day Anna Sandstrom presents to the court her written petition for aid from the county, and the court being advised in the matter, it is ordered by the court that said petition be and the same is hereby allowed in the sum of \$15.00 per month, until the further order of the court.

Matter of petition of John P Loberg, et al for county road:

On this day it appearing to the court from the receipt of N P Olson, that John P Loberg has paid the sum of \$25.00 as damages assessed in favor of said N P Olson on account of the establishment of the John Loberg road, it is ordered by the court that the clerk be, and he is hereby instructed to issue a general fund warrant in the sum of \$35.00 in favor of Jos Erickson, Sr, being the amount of such damages so assessed and remaining unpaid, as per order of court made and entered herein on the 5th day of February, 1914.
