### ORDINANCE No.....

An ordinance declaring the intention of the City Council of the City of St. Helens, Oregon, to establish a sewerage system within Sewer District No. 1 of said City; showing the location of the same; the material out of which the same shall be constructed; appointing appraisers and arbitrators to appraise the probable cost thereof; providing for notice to property owners.

Whereas, the city engineer of the City of St. Helens, Oregon, has divided said city into Sewer Districts, in accordance with the natural topography of the several additions, blocks and lots, comprising said city, of which the hereafter described district is and shall be known as Sewer District No. 1, of said City, and in relation thereto has furnished such recommendations, maps and illustrations as are needed for the guidance of the Common Council of said city.

And Whereas, said district embraces a large number of inhabitants and residents, many of whom are utterly without any system of sewerage or drainage;

And Whereas, there is grave apprehension of an epidemic of sickness from the want of proper sewer facilities in said district;

And Whereas, in the opinion of the City Council as well as in the judgment of the city health officer of said city a more complete and extended sewerage system is necessary for the health and convenience of the city and its inhabitants, and especially of that portion thereof embraced in said proposed district:—

Now, Therefore, the City of St. Helens does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That it is hereby declared, that a sewerage system, including and embracing all of the following described territory within the City of St. Helens, Oregon, to-wit:—Commencing at a point on the prolongation of the division line between lots 14 and 15, in block 11 in the City of St. Helens, Oregon, 180 feet easterly from the ne corner of said lot 15, and running thence

westerly 280 feet to the nw corner of said lot 15; thence northerly on the easterly boundary of lot 9, in said block 11 to the ne corner thereof; thence westerly 100 feet to the nw corner of said lot 9; thence northerly 161.5 feet along the westerly boundary of said block 11 and a northerly extension thereof, to the center of St. Helens street; thence westerly 640 feet along the center of said St. Helens street, to the westerly boundary of Oak street; thence southerly 275.5 feet along the westerly boundary of Oak street to the se corner of lot 15 in block 33 of said city; thence easterly 180 feet to the nw corner of lot 16 in block 26 of said city; thence southerly along the center line of said block 26 to the sw corner of lot 22 in said block 26; thence westerly 180 feet to the se corner of said block 33; thence in a direct line southerly to the se corner of block 34 of said city; thence westerly 240 feet along the southerly boundary of said block 34, to the center of Winter street; thence southerly along the center line of Winter street to the southerly boundary of said city; thence easterly following the southerly boundary of said city to the se corner of block 8 of said city; thence northeasterly in a direct line to the se corner of lot 12 in block 6 of said city; and thence northerly in a direct course to the point of beginning, is necessary for the health and convenience of the district so embracing and including said territory, and of said city; and that it is the intention of the Common Council of said city to establish a sewerage system therein.

Section 2. That the location of said sewer, with its branches, will be as shown on the plan thereof submitted by John A. McQuinn, city engineer, to the Common Council and filed with the recorder of said city on—, 1914.

Section 3. That the sewer will be of glazed, vitrified clay sewer pipe, and the sub drain will be of drain tile, the size of which together with a particular description of all other material can be ascertained by an inspection of the plan aforesaid and the specifications filed with said plan.

Section 4. That W. J. Fullerton, J. W. Allen and E. A. Rodgers, are hereby appointed appraisers and arbitrators to make the apportionment of the probable costs of said sewerage system among the real estate owners in said district, in accordance with the requirements of the City Charter, as well as to perform such other duties as are required of them, thereunder.

Section 5. That notice shall be given by the City Recorder for two successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in said city and by posting for the same length of time, in three public places in said city, definitely fixing the time and place of a meeting to be held by the Common Council of said city for the purpose of hearing any and all complaints by or on the part of any and all property owners within the limits of said district; and all persons whose property is so affected shall have the right to appear and make and file their objections to the location of the boundaries of the district, or other objections to such improvements and the said council shall have the power under this ordinance to make such alterations as it shall deem in accordance with justice and for the best interests of the city.

Section 6. Whereas, a large portion of said sewer district is without adequate sewer facilities; and whereas there is much stagnant water therein which can be disposed of only through such a system, all of which seriously and directly endanger the public peace, health and safety of the city and especially of said district; and Whereas an emergency exists, and it is urged that these dangerous conditions be obviated and remedied for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the city, it is therefore ordained that this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its approval by the Mayor of said city.

Read the second time March 16, 1914.  
Read the third time and passed by the unanimous vote of the Common Council, March 23rd, 1914.
