OREGON HOTEL TOTAL LOSS

Fire Company Does Good Work in Saving Buildings

The Oregon hotel at Houlton with all the contents was totally destroyed by fire last Thursday night. At 9 o'clock Marshall Decker discovered smoke and flames coming through the roof of the building and promptly turned in the alarm. Effort were first directed toward getting the small children of Mr. Frank Gliniecki out of the up-stairs rooms after which the real fire fighting was undertaken.

The St Helens Fire company under direction of the Chief Allen responded within a very few minutes with two hose carts and the chemical engines but on arrival at Houlton it was found that only one stand pipe had been placed on the new water main and only enough pressure was in this to test the leakage of the pipes. Within a short time Charles Lope was found where the gate was, and turned the full force of the water into the new pipe after which it was easy for the fire boys to control the fire and keep it from spreading. For a time it looked like the entire town was doomed for destruction but the very valiant and efficient work of the firemen saved the day. Before the water was turned on Chief Allen, realizing the hopelessness of fighting fire without water, wired to Portland for aid and the Chief of that city Department dispatched two auto trucks, one chemical and one engine to this city, they making a good record run of one hour and thirty minutes. It was the intention of putting the engine near Milton Creek and

pumping water from there to fight with, but before they arrived the water had been turned on and the fire was out. The building next to the hotel, owned by Judge Harris, was in flames several times and there seemed no possible chance of saving it, but outside of some damaged roof and broken windows the damage was slight.

The hotel building was owned by Frank Gliniecki who had just lately purchased it and had it remodelled and fitted up as a first class hotel. The origin of the fire is unknown but from an investigation made by the firemen it has been determined that a defective flue passing through the attic was the cause.

The very prompt and hard work of the fire boys, taken together with the installation of the city mains into that portion of the city saved the destruction of the entire business portion of Houlton. Too much praise can not be given our fire department for the efficiency displayed on each and every occasion of fire. It is a common saying among the people now that with the present organization and the great supply of water there is very little danger of a serious conflagration in this city, and this state of affairs will soon be extended so as to include West St. Helens as well.

The property owners adjoining the burned building were so well pleased with the work that checks in various amounts from \$10 to \$25 were mailed the fire company in appreciation of the good work done.

The loss at this fire will fall quite heavily on Mr. Gliniecki who had just recently purchased the property and although it was well covered by insurance, his loss will be considerable.

ROAD MEETING BEING HELD

Discussion as to Location of Highway in Progress

The County Court is in session this afternoon discussing the location of the Columbia County Highway from Tide Creek to the Multnomah County line. There is a disposition on the part of the Highway engineers to make this road up the West side of the railroad track all the way and inasmuch as most of the money received from the sale of bonds has been appropriated to build the road from Tide Creek to the Clatsop county line, the County Court and the citizens generally in this part of the County, are favoring the building of the road on the old road, where practically all of the grading and all the rights of way are finished and secured. Quite a delegation from Clatskanie and Rainier are in the city to day to urge the Court to accept the State Highway Engineer's plan in order to make sure of getting the appropriation from the State. Of course if this course is followed there will be sufficient money from the remainder of the bond issue the general tax and the State appropriation to buy at least a portion of the right of way from here to Multnomah. With \$260,000 of that already appropriated for the lower road it would certainly seem the better judgment to get the best possible results from the other \$20,000 on about one-half the road in the county.
