Due proclamation being made, the following proceedings were had:

Matter of damage to Dutch Canyon Road, occasioned by heavy loads.

On this 8th day of December, 1914, it appearing to the Court that a certain improved public highway known and designated as the "Dutch Canyon Road," in the vicinity of Scappoose, is being damaged by certain persons in hauling heavy loads of timbers over and upon said improved public highway, and that the wagons upon which said loads are hauled are being extended to an excessive length, thereby causing additional damage to said highway, it is therefor ordered by the Court that the weight of any such load, hauled upon any vehicle having tires of a width of four inches less, shall not exceed 3,000 pounds, and that such vehicle shall not be extended to a greater length

It is further ordered by the Court terminal of said pipe line in said that a copy of this order, duly cerroad, to a point at or near and op- tified by the Clerk of this Court, persons, firms or corporations, so damaging said improved public highway, by the sheriff of the county, and immediately thereafter the said sheriff shall make his return of service to the said county clerk.
