TWENTY YEARS AGO

THE MIST, January 25, 1895.

At a special meeting held at the school house Wednesday evening, a special 5-mill tax was voted to raise funds for the purpose of defraying current school expenses in this district. The directors will realize about \$400 from this rate and will thus be able to continue the school until the expiration of the current school year

It will be with regret that our young people will I arn that Mr. Gilson, of Houlton, will cut the greater amount of timber away from the skating pond known as Broyles' lake. This lake has been the scene of much merriment in the way of skating, and when the timber is cut away, it is feared that a difference will take effect in the freezing of the lake and thus spoil lots of sport.

The people of Vernonia have been experiencing considerable difficulty of late with high water. The recent heavy snow and rain was the cause of the Nehalem river and Rock creek raising to an almost unknown height sweeping logs, brush, etc., along with the raging to-rent, and flooding part of the town. Persons consequently journeyed to their places of business in small boats, so we have been informed. Spencer Rose didn't tell us, but we have good reason to believe the story.

Everything now points to the posibility of St. Helens being supplied with fresh mountain water. If the proper encouragement is manifest his thing can be brought to a successful termination, and St. Helens can have as pure, clean water as any own in the state, An improvement is possible over the present supply and we earnestly hope the change can be brought around. The proposition we believe is to bring the water from one of the large springs on Germany Hill, a thing which bould be easily done without requirng the outlay of a great amount of money. A conservative estimate places the cost of the proposition at thout \$500.

The county court at its last sesion took a step in the right direcion by not allowing road supervisers more than one day's pay for every six days worked on the roads. Road supervisors have been known o work their office for what there vas in it in Columbia County, reardless of the public good. The ate order of court, will, to some exent, prevent these abuses of public trust. Men who have the interests of the road districts at heart should be appointed to fill these offices; men who will not work the hing entirely in their own interests. It is true that a man should receive just compensation for his services, out it is evident to many that some have received pay for what they have not done


