COUNTY ORGANIZATIONS. ARTICLE I.

Name and Object. The name of this association shall he the Columbia County Taxpayers League.

The object of this organization is to reduce taxes, assist in the development of the resources of the coonty and assist the County Court and other county officials in an economical administration of County affairs. To give our support to all ncedful economical development engaged in by the county, and conneem all unnecessary and wasteful undertakings.

It shall be the duty of every member of the League to keep a keen watch upon all county expenditures in his district, to see that the county ge's honest efficient compensation for every dollar of public money expended, and the investigation and publication of all matters pertaining to said object.

We desire the co-operation of every tax-payer in the county resident or non-resident, and as large a membership as possible,

ARTICLE II. Place o Business.

The principal place of business of this association shall be in the City of St. Helens, County of Columbia, State of Oregon.

ARTICLE III. Government.

The affairs and business of this association shall be under the management and control of a board of twelve directors and an executive committee consisting of the president, vice-president and secretary, which committee shall discharge such duties and execute such functions as may be delegated to it by the Board of Directors

Membership.

Sec. 1. Any taxpayer of Columbla County shall be eligible to membership in the association,

Sec. 2. Any person desiring to become a member of the association may do so upon written application to the secretary and the payment of 25 cents membership fee.

Sec. 3. This association further desires each precinct to organize a league to be affiliated with, and become a part of the County League; and to work in conjunction with

Sec. 4. Any precinct organization sending the County League Secretary a list of the names of its members. accompanied with ten cents for each name, shall have all such names recorded as associate members of the County League; who shall have the same rights and benefits as any regular member.

Sec. 5. Each member shall be entitled to cast one vote at all meet-No votes by proxy shall be received or counted at any meetings either of the association or of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE V. Dues.

tion shall be twenty-five cents per annum, payable on or before January 1st of each year for the ensuing year or part thereof, for each member, and the same shall be used only for the purpose of defraying the expenses of carrying on the work of the association under the direction of the Board of Directors.

Sec. 2. A failure to pay the dues of the association for the period of thirty (30) days after the same become due and payable, shall thereby terminate memberable in the association until such time as all dues shall be fully paid.

ARTICLE VI.

Meetings and Order of Business, Sec. 1. There shall be at least four meetings each year at St. Helens, Oregon. The date shall be determined each year by the directors as may be expedient. The board of directors shall have power to call special meetings of the Association

at any time. Sec. 2. Notice of the time and place of the quarterly meeting shall be published in the county newspapers not less than (5) days before the time set for such meeting, and a written notice shall be mailed by the Secretary to the directors and compalttees to the address appearing on the records of the Association.

Sec.3. Notices of special meetings shall state the objects for which the same are called and no other bustness shall be transacted at any specisl meetings than that which is named in the call.

Sec. 4. Twenty or more members of the Association shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at all regular and special meetings.

Sec. 6. Roberts' rules of order shall be recognized as controlling the expenditure of miscellaneous and parliamentary proceedure of the as-

eoclation Sec. 8. The executive committee with the duty of making recommen-

dent at any time or place.

ARTICLE VII. Board of Directors.

Sec. 1. The Board of Directors shall have general control and management over the affairs of the association. Eight members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business.

Sec. 2. The Board of Directors shall be elected by the Association. The President, Vice-president and Secretary shall be ex-officio officers of the Board of Directors.

Sec. 3. The Board of Directors shall authorize the payment of all obligations incurred by the association and trancact any and all other business of the association.

Sec. 4. The Board of Directors is authorized to elect members from the association to fill vacancies upon the board.

ARTICLE VIII. Officers.

Sec. 1. The officers of the Assodation shall be a president, viceresident and secretary-treasurer.

Sec. 2. The president shall be the official head of the Association and thall preside at all meetings thereof nd at all meetings of the board of threctors, and generally perform the luties of the executive officer.

Sec. 3. The Vice-president snall exercise all the functions incident to member of the executive commitee and in the absence or disability of the president, shall perform his unctions.

Sec. 4. The Secretary shall, by drtue of his office, be treasurer of he Association and shall have tharge of the records and books of the Association and sign and issue Il notices of meetings of the memers and Board of Directors and hall sign with the president all conracts and other instruments to be executed on behalf of the Association. He shall keep lists of the nembership of the Association, colect the dues and do the clerical rork incident to carrying on the ork of the Association. The Secreary shall perform such other duties s may be delegated to him from ime to time by the Board of Directers, and shall act in the capacity of nanager of the Association's busiless under the direction and conrol of the president.

ARTICLE IX. Terms of Office.

All officers of the Association hall be elected for the term of one car and shall hold office until their

successors are elected and qualified. ARTICLE, X. Standing Committees.

Sec. 1. The president shall ap--oint standing committees annualv and they shall hold their respecive appointments until their suc essors are named and qualify. The 'ollowing standing committees shall e appointed and their duties shall e as enumerated, towit:

A-Membership. The duty of this ommittee shall be to secure mem ers for the Association.

B-Legislative. The duty of this committee shall be to recommend avestigate and foster by all proper nethods, legislation consistent with y the legislature or through the

C-Roads and Bridges. This comaittee shall be charged with the luty of investigating any and all natters pertaining to roads and ridges in which taxpayers of Coumbia County may be in any way inerested; to m ke such recommendaions as it may seem fit to public ofcials and to the association regardng the same; to investigate proposed expenditures of public funds in which the taxpayers of said county may be interested, for roads and ridge purposes; to investigate and uggest to public officials improved nethods of doing road and bridge work; to investigate and report upon expenditures made by public officers for road and bridge purposes; to aid and assist public officers in the preparation of road and bride estimates for the purpose of fixing tax levies.

D .- County Offices Committee. he committee shall be charged with the duty of investigating expenditures and the general conduct of county offices and making recommendations regarding appropriations for the support thereof and business methods and manner of conducting any such office to the association or to the grand jury; to check expenditures of public funds in the operation of county offices and to report thereon to the Association and the grand jury to the end that approprintions for county offices shall not exceed the annual budget estimate.


