COURT PROCEEDINGS

BIDS ARE LET FOR IMPROVING PERRY ROAD, NEAR HOULTON TO G. L. TARBELL & SON.

County to Improve Canaan Road—Claim Allowed.

Saturday, June 19, 1915. 12th Judicial Day.

Court came pursuant to adjournment.

Officers all present, except Commissioner Weed.

Due proclamation being made, the following proceedings were had:

Matter of bids for road improvement, in Road District No. 2 and Road District No. 3, as per published call.

On this day sealed bids for improving a portion of the Perry road, near Houlton, Ore., in Road District No. 2, were opened and examined by the Court, being as follows:

G. L. Tarbell & Son.

Clearing and grading, according to plans and specifications, for the sum of \$298.00.

And it appearing to the Court that no other bids are submitted for said improvement, and that said bid is not inconsistent with the cost of the work to be performed, it is ordered by the Court that said proposal be, and the same is hereby accepted, and that a contract be entered into for the faithful performance of the same.

And it appearing to the Court that said proposal does not include the placing of crushed rock upon said improvement, it is ordered by the Court that such portion of the work, as specified, be performed by the Road Supervisor, under the direction of the County Roadmaster.

And it appearing to the Court that no proposals are submitted for the improvement of the Canaan road in Road District No. 3, as advertised for, it is ordered by the Court that said improvement be performed by the Road Supervisor, under the direction of the County Roadmaster.

Matter of Claim of Malarkey, Seabrook & Dibble:

On this day it is ordered by the Court that certain claim of Malarkey, Seabrook & Dibble, in the sum of \$750.00, for advice and services in a etaal shrdlu emfwypp with Consolidated Contract Company, be, and the same is hereby allowed.

It is further ordered by the Court that the Clerk be, and he is hereby authorized and instructed to issue a warrant on the General Road Fund, in said sum, in favor of said claimants.

Whereupon, Court adjourned until Saturday, June 26, 1915.

Sealed proposals, addressed to the County Court of Columbia County, Oregon, and endorsed "Proposals for Constructing a Steel Bridge in Columbia County, Oregon, over the Clatskanie river, near the town of Clatskanie, will be received by the County Court of Columbia County at its office in the Court House, St. Helens, Oregon, until 2 o'clock p. m. on the 26th day of June, 1915, and at that time and place will be publicly opened and read.
