In the matter of the petition of Joseph Lumijarvi for a public road or gateway. This matter coming on to be heard this day on the verified petition of Joseph Lumijarvi filed in the above entitled Court and matter for an order appointing a Board of County Viewers herein and directing said board to meet, view, locate and mark out either a suitable public road or a gateway as therein petitioned for, and to assess the damages thereby occasioned, the petitioner appearing by his attorney, Glen R. Metsker, and it appearing from said petition that the petitioner's lands therein described and upon which he resides and maintains a residence are not reached conveniently, or in fact at all, by any public road provided by law, and that it is necessary that the public and said petitioner, the owner of said lands and residence, Joseph Lumijarvi, shall have ingress and egress from his said lands and residence, and that it will accordingly be necessary in laying out a suitable public road or gateway, as the case may be, to cross the lands of one Jafet Lindeberg, lying on the west of the petitioner's lands, as described; and it appearing that said order ought and should be granted; Now, therefore, it is ordered that H. E. Atry, L. J. Van Orsboven and John Rice, all of Columbia county, Oregon, be and they hereby are appointed a Board of County Viewers herein, and the said Board of County Viewers are hereby directed to meet on the 22nd day of May, 1916, at the residence of the petitioner herein, Joseph Lumijarvi, located and situated near the west boundary line of petitioner's lands, near Quincy, in said county, and described as follows, to-wit:

that all other proposals be, and the same are hereby rejected. On this day, it appearing to the Court from the written petition of John Phillip, Justice of the Peace, that in a certain criminal action had in the Justice Court of District No. 6, costs were charged to and paid by George Fowler, in the sum of \$15.45, whereas said charge should have been in the sum of \$11.35, it is ordered by the Court that the Clerk be, and he is hereby instructed to issue a general fund warrant in the sum of \$4.10 in favor of said George Fowler. On this day the County Roadmaster presents to the Court his plans and specifications for the improvement of the Upper Nehalem road, south of steel bridge, and Upper Nehalem road in Section 26; and the Court being advised in the matter, it is ordered by the Court that said plans and specifications be, and the same are hereby approved. It is further ordered by the Court that call or bids for such road improvement be published in two successive issues of the St. Helens Mist, and in the Clatskanie Chief, and that such bids be opened at 2 o'clock p. m., on the 22nd day of April, 1916. Proposals for certain road work having been submitted to the Court on the 5th day of April, 1916, and the Court having taken the matter under advisement, now, on this 8th day of April, 1916, it is ordered by the Court that the following named proposals, viz: Everman road, C. R. Parcher, \$994.78; E. J. Smith road, Geo. W. Grant, \$1770.00; Jos. Hackenberg road, J. R. Shultz, clearing, \$50.00 per acre, and grubbing, \$1.25 per rod, be, and the same are hereby accepted. It is further ordered by the Court that the proposal for the R. A. Lillich road, and the proposals for the Lower Nehalem road, be, and the same are hereby continued. It is further ordered that all other proposals be, and the same are hereby rejected. And it further appearing to the Court that no proposals have been submitted for the improvement of the A. Hankey road, the Mayer-Quincy road, the E. A. Cushman road and the E. J. Lindberg road, it is ordered by the Court that said improvements be made by the County Roadmaster, under the direction of the County Court.

Inspector, and the Court being advised in the matter, it is ordered by the Court that said petition be, and the same is hereby allowed. On this 8th day of April, 1916, it is ordered by the Court that the tax of Johanna Bergman, a county charge, as assessed to Edward Bergman for the year 1915, upon E 1/2 of NE 1/4 of NE 1/4 and SW 1/4 of SE 1/4 of NE 1/4, Sec. 7, T. 7 N., R. 4 W. of W.
