RIVER NOW FALLING

For the present, it seems that all danger of high water has passed. The river reached its highest stage on July 4, when it was 23.8 at Portland. The docks here were covered to a depth of about 14 inches, a little more than the high water of 1913. Ed. Ballagh is authority for the statement that the water has receded more than four inches, and from up river reports an additional fall of five inches is expected by Sunday. He expects to be able to occupy his warehouse by the middle of the coming week.

It is further ordered by the Court that the Clerk of this Court be, and he hereby is instructed to issue a General Fund Warrant in favor of J. P. Leonard, in the sum of \$250.00.

ORDINANCE NO. 190

An ordinance declaring it the duty of all owners of land adjoining any street in the city of St. Helens, to construct, reconstruct and maintain in good repair all the sidewalks or steps in front of said land, at their own cost and expense.

The City of St. Helens does ordain as follows: Section 1. It is hereby declared to be the duty, and it is the duty, of all owners of all land adjoining any street in the City of St. Helens to construct, reconstruct and maintain in good repair, the sidewalks or steps in front of said land, at the expense and cost of such owners.

Section 2. That whenever it becomes necessary for said City to construct, reconstruct or maintain in good repair, any sidewalk, because of the refusal or failure of the abutting property owner to do, the cost of such improvement shall be taxed to the owner of such abutting property, and constitute a lien upon said property.
