RESOLUTION

Whereas, the Common Council of the City of St. Helens, Oregon, deem it expedient to reconstruct the sidewalk along the south side of Willamette Street, from the West boundary line of Columbia Street to the center of Block 64, in said City, and assess the cost of such reconstruction to the owners of the property abutting thereon.

Therefore be it resolved by said Common Council of the City of St. Helens, Oregon, that Willamette Street, in said City of St. Helens, Oregon, between the west line of Columbia Street and the center line of Block 64 of said City, be improved, and said Council hereby declares its intention to improve the same, by the construction of a wooden sidewalk, eight feet in width, along the south side of said Street, according to the plans and specifications of the City Engineer on file with the Recorder of said City; and also in accordance with the grade now established for such sidewalk.

The following is the City Engineer's estimate of the probable cost of said improvement, to-wit: Lot 12 in Block 17; Lot 11 in Block 17; Lot 12 in Block 27; Lot 11 in Block 27; Lot 12 in Block 43; Lot 11 in Block 43; Lot 12 in Block 59; Lot 11 in Block 59; and Lot 12 in Block 64; Total estimate \$910.00.
