**ORDINANCE NO. 194**

An Ordinance regulating the sewerage of property lying outside of any established sewer District in the City of St. Helens, Oregon. The City of St. Helens does ordain as follows:

Section 1. No person, firm or corporation, owning property outside of any established Sewer District in the City of St. Helens, Oregon, or which has not been previously assessed, shall connect such property with the sewer of any District outside of which said property is located, without first making application to the Common Council of said City for permission to do so.

Section 2. Upon the filing of any such application the Common Council of said City shall ascertain if such sewer to which such connection is proposed to be made, can conveniently carry additional sewage, and if so satisfied said Council shall require such applicant to pay into the City Treasury a sum in cash, equal to the original assessment in such District on like property; and upon such payment, and the payment of all additional expenses to which said City shall have been subjected by reason of such connection, said Council shall make an order allowing such sewer connection.

**NEW PENSION BILL**

The lower house of congress has passed some new pension legislation that if approved by the senate, which seems probable, will be of benefit to many of our readers. The new pension legislation provides:

First—Any widow who was the wife of a soldier during the civil war is entitled to \$20 per month.

Second—Any widow who married since the war who has attained the age of 70 years is entitled to \$20 per month.

Third—Any widow who was a pensioner and remarried, and the second husband is dead or she is divorced from him, is entitled to have her pension restored at \$12 per month until she becomes 70, when she shall receive \$20 per month.

Fourth—Any widow who was married to a soldier after June 27, 1890, and before 1905, can secure a pension of \$22 per month, until she is 70, and then receive \$24 per month.

**LOOKOUT STATION ON ST. HELENS**

Returned visitors from Mt. St. Helens say that the snow has disappeared rapidly since the first of the month and that the country is clear and generally with the exception of a few drifts in the shady sections, campers are going to the lake for an outing now that the snow is gone.

Building of the lookout station on the summit of the mountain is in progress. The building will be of angle iron and will be covered with sheet steel. Carrying of this material to the top of the mountain is a tedious work. A patrolman will be stationed at the lookout throughout the fire season, and will have a phone connection with the station at Spirit Lake. Fires can be easily located from a lofty lookout tower such as this. The tower will be heated with coal oil during cold weather, and will provide a refuge for unwary climbers who are caught on the summit.
