INDUSTRIAL REVIEW

Flax experts maintain that flax raised in Oregon is superior to any grown elsewhere.

The sawmills at Dallas have contracted for 1,000,000 feet of fir logs which were cut by the Southern Pacific on their Coos Bay line.

During the past year Linn county built 70 miles of graveled or crushed rock road and is making plans for still further road building this year.

The brickyard at Beaverton which has been idle during the past two years now plans to open under new management. The industry will give employment to 40 persons.

Farmers in the vicinity of Cottage Grove are preparing to raise more sugar beets during the coming year. The Utah-Idaho Sugar company that has a plant at Grants Pass, has offered \$6.50 per ton for the sugar beets, which will enable the farmer to make a good profit.

A new modern concrete garage building at The Dalles is planned.

Libby, McNeill & Libby are making negotiations towards the erection of a canning establishment at Fairview.

From Roseburg comes the report that 35 miles of telephone line are to be constructed in the Umpqua national forest.

Hepner farmers will gather February 3 to plan on building a grain elevator.

A flour mill is in prospect for Jordan Valley near Ontario.

BUILDING HUNTING-TON JETTY BEGUN

Capt. Albert Burcham has his pile-driving outfit at the Huntington bar in front of the Wallace Huntington place, two miles below town, driving the 300-foot jetty, for which he was awarded the contract some time ago.

Capt. Burcham was also given the contract to supply the piling for the jetty. When this jetty is completed it will greatly aid in the opening of the channel over that bar, which has been a serious obstacle to the navigation of the Cowlitz. The dredge Monticello is working in the river in front of the Huntington place at the present time.—Kelsonian.

POULTRY VALUES DOUBLE IN 9 YEARS

During the nine years in which the O. A. C. poultry department has been working for better and more profitable poultry in Oregon the value of the poultry industry has jumped from four million to eight million dollars a year. When the work was begun the college flocks averaged about 80 eggs per annum for each hen, while at the present time many large flocks average 200 per annum. Thousands of eggs and hundreds of cockerels have been sent into different parts of the state, thus contributing directly to the increased value of the poultry business.

MONEY ASKED FOR COOS BAY WORK

An appropriation of \$80,000 for the harbor improvement of Coos Bay is recommended in the annual report of the chief of United States engineers. There is also an unexpended balance of \$96,576 of previous appropriations.

Although nearly 50,000,000 bushels of rye were produced in the United States in 1915, this is less than 3 per cent of the world's annual production of the crop. Nearly 80 per cent of the crop of the United States is grown east of a line from the boundary between Minnesota and North Dakota to the southernmost point of Texas.
