

GARDEN PESTS MUST BE GUARDED AGAINST

Home Gardeners Should Prepare to Combat Insects.

Now that the back to the soil request of the government is being responded to by many citizens of Columbia county, some of whom have not had agricultural experience, the information following, which is sent out by the United States department of agriculture, will be of much aid and assist in the work of raising food stuffs. Other methods of protecting plants from the larger eating insects are to pick the posts by hand or knock them with a stick into a pan containing water on which a thin film of kerosene is floating. Insects collected by hand should be destroyed promptly. Young plants may be protected by setting over them wooden frames overed with mosquito netting, wire mesh or cheesecloth. Cutworms may e kept from plants by setting tin or saper collars into the ground around he stalks.

CARBON BISULFID FOR BEAN AND PEA WEEVIL

stored Seeds Showing Large Round **Holes** Need Treatment.

Beans and peas stored for seed, showing large round holes in the sides, are infested with weevils and need fumigation with carbon bisulfid gas before being planted, says A. L. Lovett, entomologist of the O. A. C. experiment station.

"The adult weevil is a small, olivedrab beetle that appears in the field at blossoming time and deposits eggs along the keel of the developing pods. The eggs hatch into grubs that enter and feed on the maturing seeds in which they are still present when the seed is stored."

Carbon bisulfid fumigation is the standard treatment. The tin or container in which the seeds are stored is made as nearly gas proof as postible. For each 15 bushels of seed, one pound of carbon bisulfid is used. It may be poured over the seeds or placed in shallow tmays above them. The bin should be securely closed for 24 hours, then opened and thoroughly aired.

Caution should be used in handling the carbon bisulfid, as it is very inflammable. Do not open near a hot stove or use a light or smoke while treating the seed.

Another treatment for the weevil is to pour the seed into a vessel of colling water. Before doing this have eady for instant use a supply of cold water which must immediately be udded to the water containing the seeds. The infested seeds will float and may be skimmed off. This treatment is advisable only when the seeds can be planted at once.


Neither of the treatments should injure the vitality of the seed.
