

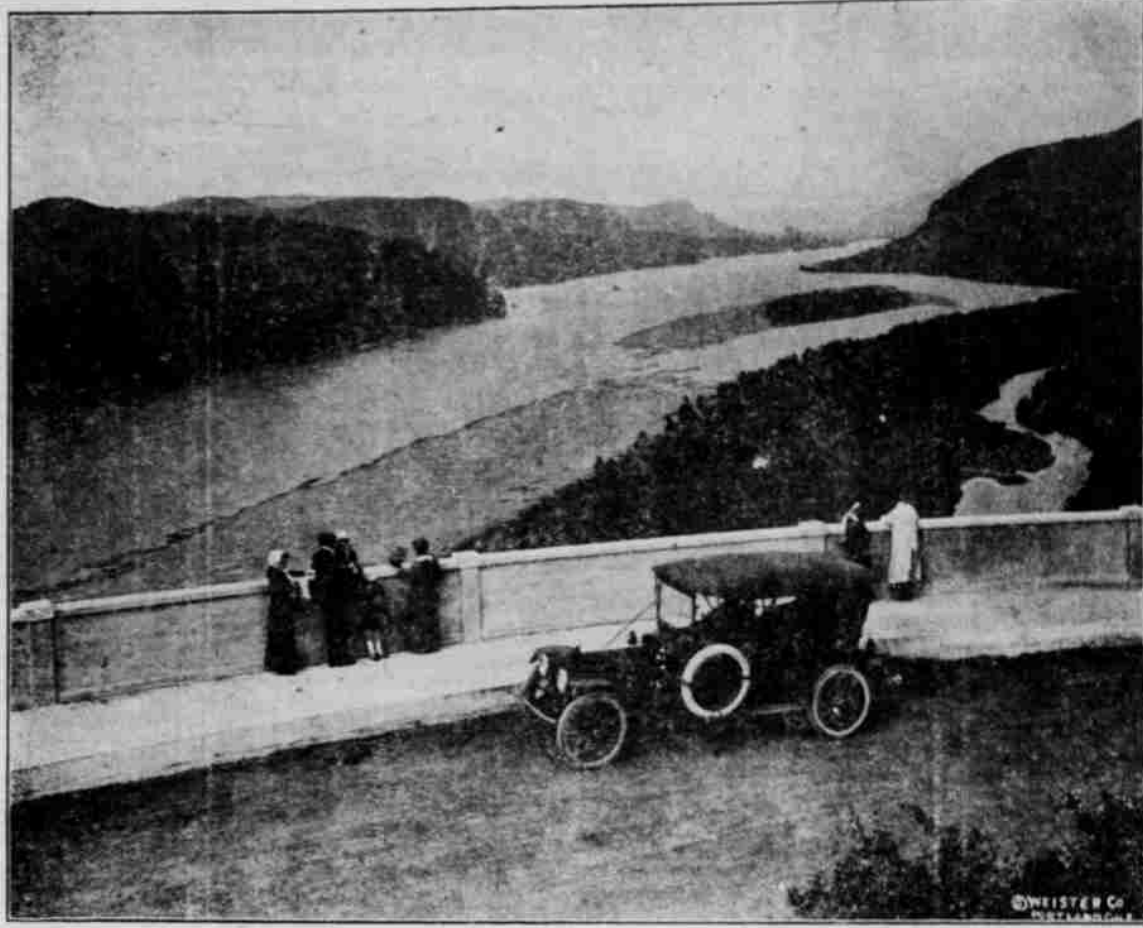
**OBITUARY**

Joseph W. Bonnell was born in Pennsylvania August 5, 1854, and died April 23, 1917, aged 62 years. He has resided in Oregon many years, and had been employed near St. Helens about 20 years. For many years he was in the railway service. Mr. Bonnell went to Scappoose about ten years ago, where he tended the logging railroad tower. Deceased was married to Mrs. Gustie Pearson in 1911. He was a member of Portland Tent No. 1, of the Maccabees.

Besides his bereaved wife he leaves a sister in Tacoma and a stepson. His other relatives are living in the east.

The funeral services were conducted from the Congregational church at 2 p. m., Rev. Johnston officiating. Music was rendered by the Congregational church choir. A large concourse of friends followed the remains to Fairview cemetery, where they were laid to rest under a profusion of beautiful flowers, which represented the kind thoughts of sympathetic friends.

The record keeper of Portland Tent No. 1, George D. Baker, attended the funeral as a representative of the order and presented an elegant wreath from that order. Another beautiful wreath was sent by Mr. McNaughton and Mr. Hepworth as a token of respect from the Nehalem Timber & Logging Company and the Southwestern Railroad Company. The Lady Maccabees of Scappoose, of which Mrs. Bonnell was a member, gave as their offering an artistic casket spray.

**Kelso Hopes to Find Good Market in East Next Season**

The last shipments of smelt made from Kelso last week. Figures compiled by local statisticians show that approximately 125,000 boxes, 50 pounds each were dispatched. This is equivalent to 3125 tons, or more than 300 carloads.

About 30 carloads were shipped to eastern markets this year, and Kelso hopes to develop an immediate market in the east in future years.

**ORDINANCE NO. 204**

An Ordinance relating to intoxicating liquor, prohibiting the sale thereof, or the soliciting and taking orders therefor, its carriage to or possession at dances, dance halls or other public gatherings, and the maintaining of a locker or club-room, or any private place where such liquor is kept for beverage purposes, prohibiting drunkenness, and the possession of liquor by any person within the corporate limits of the City of St. Helens.

The City of St. Helens does ordain as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to solicit, take or receive, within the corporate limits of the City of St. Helens, Oregon, any order for intoxicating liquor, or make any contract for the sale of any intoxicating liquor, except in cases where the sale of said liquor, within the State, is permitted.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to give away or furnish any intoxicating liquor to any person or persons within the corporate limits of the City of St. Helens, Oregon, or to receive or take anything of value for the same.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful

for any person directly or indirectly, to keep or maintain by himself, or by associating or combining with others, or in any manner to aid, assist, or abet in keeping or maintaining any locker, room, club room, or other similar place within the corporate limits of the City of St. Helens, Oregon, in which intoxicating liquors are received, or kept for the purpose of use, gift, barter, or sale as a beverage, and it shall be unlawful for any person to use, barter, sell or give away, or assist or abet another in bartering, selling or giving away any intoxicating liquors so received or kept.

Section 4. It shall be unlawful for any person to carry intoxicating liquor to any dance, or dance hall, or other public gathering or to have intoxicating liquor in his possession at any such dance, dance hall or other public gathering within the corporate limits of the City of St. Helens, Oregon.

Section 5. It shall be unlawful for any person to enter or be found in a state of intoxication or to drink intoxicating liquor of any kind, as a beverage, in or upon any engine, cars, train of cars, boat, landing, wharf, or depot within the City of

St. Helens, Oregon; and it shall be unlawful for any person to be drunk in any highway, street, or in any public place or building, or for any person to be drunk in any private building or place and disturbing others.

Section 6. It shall be unlawful for any person to have in his possession, within the corporate limits of the City of St. Helens, Oregon, any intoxicating liquors not permitted by the general laws of the State of Oregon.

Section 7. Any person or persons who shall violate any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine in any sum not less than Ten Dollars, and not more than One Hundred Dollars, or be imprisoned in the City jail for a period not exceeding fifty days.

Section 8. All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

**NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS**

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of St. Helens, Oregon, deem it expedient to construct a sidewalk along the North side of Tualatin street from the southeast corner of lot 22 of Block 25, to the southeast corner of Block 34, in said City, thence northerly along the east side of Block 34 to the Northeast corner of said Block 34, and assess the cost of such construction to the owners of the property abutting thereon.

THEREFORE, Be it resolved by said Common Council of the City of St. Helens that Tualatin Street and Oak Street, in said City of St. Helens, Oregon, be improved by the construction of a wooden sidewalk along the north side of Tualatin Street from the southeast corner of lot 22 of Block 25, to the southeast corner of Block 34, in said City, thence northerly, on Oak Street along the east side of Block 34 to the Northeast corner of said Block according to the established grade and plans and the specifications of the City Engineer on file with the Recorder of said City; and said common Council hereby declares its intention to so improve said Streets.

And it appearing that the said City Engineer upon the orders of said City Council, has made the necessary surveys, plans and specifications for said improvement and has placed the total estimate of such improvement at the sum of \$485.00.

NOW THEREFORE, be it further resolved that the Engineer's plans, specifications and estimates be, and the same hereby is approved.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the cost of the construction of said sidewalk be assessed to the owners of the property adjacent thereto, if the same be not constructed by the owners of such real property; and that the City Recorder give notice to the property owners to be affected by such improvement in the manner provided by the Charter of said city, requiring and ordering said property owners to build and complete sidewalks.
