### NEWS NOTES OF OREGON'S PROGRESS

The Standard Oil Company, realizing the advantages of Astoria as a distributing point, has made application to the city council for a permit to build a \$150,000 plant in that city.

The Logan placer mine in Josephine county recently sent \$7,000 in gold bricks to the United States mint. Bean cleaning plants to cost from \$8,000 to \$10,000 will be established in Salem and Eugene.

The new telephone lines between Pendleton and Walla Walla will cost in the neighborhood of \$10,000. Construction work is now in progress.

A large quarry has been opened near Shedd and will supply the S. P. Co. with rock for ballasting.

The shipyard at Bandon which has been idle for some time, has been sold to the Pacific Shipbuilding Company of San Francisco. The new owners plan to make improvements and have several contracts for wooden vessels.

The canning plant at Creswell has been leased to the Fruit Growers' Association, who will operate the plant to full capacity during the coming season.

The Pacific States Telephone Company is making extensive improvements on their line between Newport, Toledo and points in the Willamette valley.

The directors of the Pacific Light & Power Company have authorized their manager at Pendleton to expend \$9,500 in improving the system in the "Roundup" city.

The First Baptist church of Corvallis will have a house of worship that will cost \$15,000 when completed.

The state highway commission will hold a joint session on June 1 at Fossil with the Wheeler county court and award a contract for six miles of improvement between Fossil and the Wheeler county line. It is expected the improvement will cost about \$10,000.

Bids for contract for paving the Siskiyou highway from the summit of the mountain to the California line are to be advertised for at Ashland, according to a statement issued by State Highway Engineer Nunn. Work will be started immediately and finished this summer.

The condensary at Selo recently purchased by the Logan Commercial Company of Seattle, will be enlarged. New equipment will be installed and the output increased so as to meet the demands for the company's product.

The survey has been completed and work begun with a large crew of men and teams on the first unit of the improvement of the county road running west of Sutherlin to the Umpqua river and Coles Valley. In the winter time this road has been practically impassable, but with the contemplated work done it will be a good all the year around road.

### NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of St. Helens, Oregon, deem it expedient to construct a sidewalk along the North side of Tualatin street from the southeast corner of lot 22 of Block 25, to the southeast corner of Block 34, in said City, thence northerly along the east side of Block 34 to the Northeast corner of said Block 34, and assess the cost of such construction to the owners of the property abutting thereon.

THEREFORE, Be it resolved by said Common Council of the City of St. Helens that Tualatin Street and Oak Street, in said City of St. Helens, Oregon, be improved by the construction of a wooden sidewalk along the north side of Tualatin Street from the southeast corner of lot 22 of Block 25, to the southeast corner of Block 34, in said City, thence northerly, on Oak Street along the east side of Block 34 to the Northeast corner of said Block 34 according to the established grade and plans and the specifications of the City Engineer on file with the Recorder of said City; and said common Council hereby declares its intention to so improve said Streets.

And it appearing that the said City Engineer upon the orders of said City Council, has made the necessary surveys, plans and specifications for said improvement and has placed the total estimate of such improvement at the sum of \$485.00.

NOW THEREFORE, be it further resolved that the Engineer's plans, specifications and estimates be, and the same hereby is approved.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the cost of the construction of said sidewalk be assessed to the owners of the property adjacent thereto, if the same be not constructed by the owners of such real property; and that the City Recorder give notice to the property owners to be affected by such improvement in the manner provided by the Charter of said city, requiring and ordering said property owners to built and complete sidewalks.

Passed by the City Council April 3d, 1917.

Pursuant to the foregoing Resolution and the Charter of said City, NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to the property owners affected by said proposed improvement, and to all persons interested therein, to appear and make and file with the Recorder of said City, within 20 days from the date of the first publication hereof, your written Remonstrances against the proposed improvement.

### FOREST SERVICE BUILDS TRAIL

Two miles of the most difficult part of a trail between Hadley and Kasaan on the Tongass national forest, Alaska, have just been completed according to a report received by District Forester George H. Cecil, Portland, Oregon.

When finished this trail will be six miles long and will connect the settlements at Hadley and Kasaan. The cost of construction is estimated at \$1,000 a mile, which will be paid from the 10 per cent road fund derived from national forest receipts.

This trail will be a great convenience to the more than 300 men employed in the three working mines and several prospects which it will tap. Ultimately it may extend six miles beyond Kasaan to the It mine.

Forest Supervisor W. G. Weigle, of Ketchikan, is in charge of the trail work.

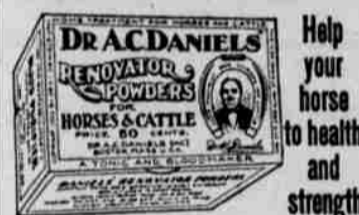
