

**INDUSTRIAL REVIEW**

Salem—State emergency board has \$250,000 appropriated, for a fund to four companies motorcycle police to guard Oregon industries against I. W. W.

Gardner—New light plant going in to serve lower Umpqua towns.

Grants Pass—Alameda mine installing new machinery.

Marshfield—Saubert mill, for several years idle, to operate.

Detroit—470 acres burned over land near here to be reclaimed this spring.

Marshfield—Coos Bay Shipbuilding Co. to increase force to 650 men. Minimum wage paid is \$4.40 for eight hours work, scale running up to \$6.60 per day.

North Powder—Farmers of vicinity co-operate in construction of \$15,000 elevator.

Salem—Building of starch factory by Pacific Potato Starch Co. of Portland practically assured.

Brownsville cannery enlarged by purchase of Corvallis plant.

Milton—Contract let for new Methodist church.

Milton—Car of locust timber shipped to Portland shipyards.

Beaverton has dedicated \$150,000 starch factory.

Astoria follows Portland with a liberty hall to boost war bond sales.

Portland—Contract for erection of

1,046,160 bushel municipal grain elevator to be awarded.

Reedsport—Sawmills in lower Umpqua district busy; new road to cost \$8,000.

Milton—Warehouse being moved to make room for large bulk grain elevator.

Salem—Contract awarded for Coliseum at State Fair grounds, to cost \$75,000.

North Bend—\$141,800 a month in payroll of Coos Bay industries.

North Bend—Construction of Jetty at north entrance of Umpqua river to cost \$553,000.

Adams (Umatilla county)—320 acres wheat land west of here sold for \$200 an acre.

Halfway—This community will build modern \$10,000 church this summer.

Corvallis—Willamette Stock & Land Co. gets government spruce contract to cut 3,000,000 feet. Electrically equipped plant to put in on Siletz bay.

**KEEP COW BARN CLEAN**

The most common defect in dairy stables is a lack of cleanliness; cobwebs on the ceiling and manure on the walls are too common in some places. The dairyman must not allow cobwebs, dust or dirt to accumulate if he expects to produce the highest grade of milk. With a tight, smooth ceiling and smooth walls without ledges this is not difficult.

Whitewash should be freely applied both to the walls and ceiling at least twice a year, as it helps to purify the stable and to keep it light. An abundance of light is necessary; four square feet of glass for each cow is generally sufficient if the windows are well distributed and not obstructed in any way. If the stable is located with its length north and south it receives the purifying benefits of both morning and afternoon sun.

A large number of petty officers will be advanced to warrant ranks, the warrants they replace being given commissions, and many will jump direct from the rating of petty officer to commissions.
