

**INDUSTRIAL REVIEW**

Oregon leads the entire United States in the number of wooden steamer hulls launched for the Emergency Fleet Corporation, the total in the country being 33 vessels launched in six districts, while 15 of the number are afloat in Oregon waters. That gives the state three more wooden vessels afloat than the five other districts combined.

Milton—Work of grading North Main street started.

Roseburg—The 1918 crop prospects are good. Surveys determine definitely that at least a 70 per cent yield will be enjoyed this season by orange orchardists. Production will equal 1917.

Roseburg—Broccoli crop brings over \$20,000 cash to growers the last two months.

Toledo is to build a new reservoir twice the capacity of the old one.

Roseburg—Subcontract for grading a stretch of the new Pacific Highway along Booth ranch let.

Portland—Pacific Car & Foundry Co. "launches" first fleet of box cars. Has orders for 700 from the Union Pacific Southern Pacific systems and \$100 from the government. Such orders will require millions of feet of lumber and this industry is similar to the shipbuilding industry in its importance to Portland.

Roseburg—Army aviation school may be established in this vicinity.

North Bend—Belka Logging Co. log Empire track. Will be cut saw logs, railroad ties, poles, and ship knees.

Toledo—Work on Toledo-Siletz is forging ahead.

Pendleton—Local phone plant will be enlarged. Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Co. has authorized the installation of two additional sectional switchboards.

Canneries of Salmon expect busy season. Salem-Kings dehydrating plant prepared to fill 1,000,000 tins; 100 persons employed.

Coquille—Contract is let to Anderson & Klocker to build Coos Bay bridge. Cost \$12,064.50.

Toledo—Electric Light Co. to enlarge capacity; two new boilers will be added to plant. Reported an electric railroad will be built from Newport to Toledo this summer. Survey has already been completed.

McMinnville—Dennis Construction Co. awarded contract for constructing two million gallon reservoir and additional pipe line from reservoir to city. Combined cost \$24,904.

Toledo—Petition granted for the bridge to be built across Yaquina river here.

Taft—To build docks here soon. Construction to cost about \$6,000.

Toledo—New mill to be shipped in here. Capacity of 50,000 feet.

Toledo—Public land to be open. Lincoln county has 14,865 acres of land O. & C. land grant.

Albany—Replanting to start soon in Santiam forest. 320,000 trees to be planted.

On this day the report of the Board of Road Viewers on the establishment of the Simon road was read in open court for the first time.

On this day the report of the Board of Road Viewers on the establishment of the English road was read in open court for the first time.

Whereupon Court adjourned until May 3, 1918.

Thursday, May 2nd, 1918. 2nd Judicial Day. Court came pursuant to adjournment. Officers all present. Due proclamation being made, the following proceedings were had.

On this day the report of the Board of Road Viewers on the establishment of the Simon road was read in open court for the second time.

On this day the report of the board of road viewers on the establishment of the Gold road was read in open court for the second time.

On this day the report of the board of road viewers on the establishment of the English road was read in open court for the second time.

Matter of claim of Burt West for Cattle Indemnity.

On this 2nd day of May, 1918, Mr. Burt West presents to the Court his claim for indemnity in the sum of \$167.50 for thirteen grade cows over two years of age slaughtered under the supervision of the State Live Stock Sanitary Board, under the provisions of the law relating thereto, and it appearing to the Court that thirty days have not elapsed since the date of the said slaughter and the date of filing of the said petition and claim, and the Court being advised in the matter it is ordered that a public hearing of the said claim be held in the County Court Room in the City of St. Helens, Oregon, at 2 o'clock P. M. on the 5th day of June, 1918, for the purpose of determining whether the said Burt West has complied with all the laws in regards thereto and whether or not he is entitled to receive the said indemnity as claimed.

Matter of petition of I. G. Wikstrom et al. for county road to be known as the Parson road.

On this day comes on for hearing the petition of I. G. Wikstrom et al. freeholders residing in the road district or districts of the said proposed road, praying for the establishment of a county road described as follows to-wit:

Beginning at a stake marked "A" in the center of the county road 640 feet north of the Southwest corner of the NW 1/4 of section 34 in Township 4 North, range 2 west, thence in a southwesterly direction along the present traveled road, as near as practicable, to a stake marked "B"; thence in a westerly direction along the creek to a stake marked "D" set in the center of the county road in section 4 in Township 3 north, range 2 west, known as the Skuzie road.

And it satisfactorily appearing to the Court from the proof filed herein that due notice of the pendency of this proceeding has been given as by law required, and that twelve of the said petitioners are freeholders and residents within the district or districts of the said proposed road, and that a good and sufficient bond, as by law required, has been given and filed herein.

It is therefore ordered by the Court, That the board of county road viewers meet at the beginning of the said proposed road on the 21st day of May, 1918, at 9:30 A. M. or on their failure to do so, then within five days thereafter, and proceed to view, survey, locate and lay out the said proposed road.

On this day comes on for hearing the petition of John Dowd et al. freeholders in the road district or districts of the said proposed road, praying for the establishment of a county road described as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at a stake marked "A" which is about 1160 feet west and about 530 feet south of the Northeast corner of section 10, T. 4 N., R. 2 W., said starting point being also identical with station 78 of the Brooks road, thence running in the northwesterly direction to the railroad grade, thence along the said railroad grade in a northerly and northwesterly direction through sections 3 and 4 and ending in said railroad grade at or near the northwest corner of said section 4, Township 4 N., R. 2 W.

And it satisfactorily appearing to the Court from the proof filed herein that due notice of the pendency of this proceeding has been given as by law required, and that twelve of the said petitioners are freeholders and residents within the district or districts of the said proposed road and that a good and sufficient bond as by law required has been given and filed herein:
