

ROADS AND BRIDGE CONTRACTS ARE LET

For clearing and filling the Young's River Falls between the McGregor farm and the county court on Friday the contract to the Warren Construction Co. for \$25,025.80. This work of road is to be graded 24 in width, 39,980 cubic yards of material being involved. The price is for 59 cents a cubic yard, an exceptionally good price at this time. Roadmaster Rose's estimate was even higher, \$27,398. The work was to be completed by September 23. Two other contracts were let yesterday, one for the bridge over Deep Creek near the Carl Anderson place at Vesper on county road 77 and the other for a road between the McKeever and Gaston places at Jewell. For the construction of the wooden bridge, which is to be completed by August 1, two bids were received: Oscar J. Johnson's for \$17,500 and the Jewell Lumber Co. for \$25,600. The former was accepted. Mr. Rose's estimate on this work was \$1800. The Jewell Lumber Co. with a bid of \$12,300 won the contract for the bridge over the road, which is about 2900 feet long and 20 feet wide. Two other bids were received, Jim May's for \$19,362 and Ralph Woodson's for \$20,800. The former was accepted. Mr. Rose's estimate on this work was \$1825.00.

TECHNICAL TRAINING FOR COLORED SOLDIERS

Nearly 157,000 negro soldiers are in the National Army. Of these are line officers holding commissions of captain and first and second lieutenants. There are about 10,000 colored officers in the medical and dental reserve corps. The army now includes two divisions of colored troops, which when constituted will include practically all branches of the service: infantry, engineer, artillery, signal corps, medical corps and service battalions with men technically trained in all branches of scientific work. There are now openings in the primary corps for negroes skilled in veterinary and agricultural work. Management has been completed and negroes registered but not called to schools and colleges in summer for training in radio engineering, auto mechanics, blacksmithing and the operation of motor vehicles.
